Seniors hike set at Mountsberg

Mountsberg Wildlife Centre welcomes senior groups to experience special nature programs. Watch wild birds banded and released or come face-to-face with Snowy Owls, Redtailed Hawks and Great Horned owls. Take a leisurely horse drawn ride along winding trails and tall

trees. Learn how to attract birds to your backyard or see how maple syrup is made at Mountsberg's Sugar Bush. For hiking enthusiasts, groups can explore flora, fauna and geology along the Niagara Escarpment, Nassagaweya Canyon or Halton

conservation areas.

Staff naturalists will spend a half day or full day translating nature's wonders. Most programs are offered year-round and include an introductory slide presentation. Group fees are \$2.25/person for a half day program or \$4.50/person for a full day program.

Reservation are taken yearround by calling the Administration Office of the Halton Region Conservation Authority (336-1158). Mountsberg Wildlife Centre is located five kilometres west of Campbellville on Milborough Line.
