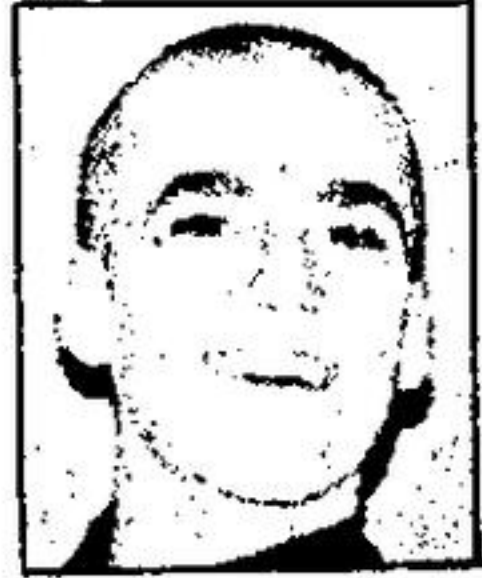


Donker, Scott blaze trails at Henry Carr track and field meet

HIGH SCHOOL

Bob Donker led the way as the GDHS Rebels put in an excellent weekend of work at the annual Father Henry Carr track and field meet at Etobicoke's Centennial Stadium last Friday and Saturday.

Donker earned a pair of first place finishes - junior boys 1500-metres and junior boys 3000-metres - and was subsequently voted the top junior male athlete at the meet.

Jake Mashinter also turned in a gold medal performance, winning first place in the midget boys javelin with a respectable toss of 46.34-metres, marking a spanking new GDHS school record. What made the accomplishment even more notable was the fact Mashinter had never even thrown the javelin before the meet. "He just showed up and threw it," said delighted GDHS head coach Bevin Clarke.

Another school record was established on Friday as standout midget athlete Trent Cull heaved the shot a distance of 15.17-metres, breaking his own previous school record set just two weeks earlier.

Other Rebels in the top three of their respective events included Brent Couling (second in midget boys 800-metres) and Scott Hobbs (third in midget boys triple jump at 11.98-metres).

Megan Lusby was fourth in the junior girls 3000, Teri Korzack was fourth in the senior girls 200 and the open-girls 4x4 relay team (Kristy Lewis, Anna Toone, Sarah Broughton and Sheri Nairn) also earned a fourth.

Natalie Goldson finished fourth in both the junior girls 400-metre

hurdles and javelin as well as placing sixth in the 80-metre hurdles. Jake Mashinter added a fourth in the midget boys 800 and the Rebels open boys 4x4 relay team (Glenn Mulder, Dave Lawrence, Rob Jickling and Mike Dyer) grabbed fifth.

The Rebels track contingent is busy again this week with the annual Nelson Relays at Burlington on Friday followed by the Roland Games at Toronto's St. Michaels Academy on Saturday.

Jennifer Scott was the star of the show as the Acton Redmen ran, jumped and threw well at the Father Henry Carr Track and Field meet at Etobicoke's Centennial Stadium last Friday.

Scott took gold in the senior girls triple jump, outleaping her nearest competition by a comfortable 60 centimetres and added a fourth in the long jump. "She'll be a good bet for OFSAA again," said AHS coach Shelley Rogne. "Most of Jennifer's OFSAA competition was at this meet."

Over 100 schools and more than 1000 athletes participated in the weekend event and Scott's performance was not the only one to leave Rogne and her fellow Redmen coaches with smiles on their faces.

Tracy Hagen enjoyed a banner day, placing second in both the midget girls discus and midget girls high jump. Dave Osborne earned a third in midget boys high jump and ended his day with an eighth in the midget boys 800-metre run. Osborne led throughout the final heat but was outspurred in the late stages and finished with a respectable clocking of two-minutes, 20 seconds.

In the sprints, Paulette Vaughan and Tanya Holley each earned spots in the finals of their

respective events. Vaughan ran sixth in the junior girls 100-metre final while Holley also finished sixth in the midget girls 200-metre final. Both girls ran personal best times.

Midget athlete Matt Elliott was a pleasant surprise for the Acton team as he saw a full second off his times in both the 100 and 200, finishing in the top 10 of each with a pair of ninth place finishes. "That was pretty good considering there were about 100 kids in those two events," said Rogne. Elliott also qualified in the triple jump where he set a personal best distance.

The Redmen will be hard at their relay training over the week as they prepare for the annual Rebel Classic Invitational Relays at GDHS on May 2.

Tough openers for Rebels

It was a tough way to open the 1989 rugby season as the GDHS Rebels travelled to Oakville last Thursday to meet perennial powerhouse Oakville-Trafalgar.

Although the results were predictable, with the Red Devils making a clean sweep of the midget-junior-senior tripleheader, GDHS coach Bill Bingham was pleased with the efforts of his charges.

"The seniors did quite well, they played fantastic on defence and stopped a couple of O-T penalty plays within our five yard line," said Bingham of a respectable 12-0 senior loss to O-T.

On the junior side, things weren't quite as rosy as a larger Red Devil pack helped O-T roll to a big 50-0 win. In midget play, Trent Cull turned in a scintillating full-field run for one of his two tries as the Rebels lost a 42-8 decision. "He made three tackles, shook the ball loose and ran 60 yards for one of his tries," said Bingham.

Meanwhile, Rebels used an exhibition tripleheader with Assumption Crusaders on Monday at GDHS to help work on some of the lessons learned in Oakville and the results were very encouraging.

Scrumhalf Wade Serjeantson and Brent Presswood, playing his first rugby this season, each scored a pair of tries as the seniors trashed the Cru' by a 24-6 count. Hooker Andrew Mackenzie added one Rebel try and fullback Trevor Harkley was a commendable four-for-five in the convert department. "He played well," said Bingham.

The junior Rebs also won, earning a 12-8 victory, while the midgets worked hard and made it close in a 9-0 loss, with Assumption scoring points late in the confrontation.

Rebels host Acton juniors tomorrow and Assumptior midgets, also on Thursday.

Redmen get their kicks

Brad Thorpe had the distinction of being the only Acton Redmen rugby player to score points as the AHS squads opened their 1989 Halton high school season last Thursday in Acton.

Thorpe kicked all of the AHS midget team points in a tripleheader-opening 12-9 loss to Assumption Crusaders as he made good on three penalty kicks, including two booming efforts from 40 yards out.

The lead changed hands often in a spirited, often rough-house affair which saw two Acton players ejected for high tackling fouls. Despite finishing the game 13 players to 15, the Redmen were still knocking on the door at fulltime and were always in contention with Thorpe's lethal boot at the ready.

Meanwhile, Adam Croll couldn't find the handle in the end

zone as he dropped a potential try-scoring ball and two other Acton tries were called back by the referee as the junior Redmen suffered a close 4-0 loss to Assumption.

On the senior side, Acton took the heaviest loss of the day, absorbing a 20-0 whitewashing from the more experienced Crusader side. Making a most positive comment on a game but short-staffed Acton senior side, coach Dave Boycott said his charges would, "rather play and lose than not play at all."

Redmen face arch-rival Georgetown at GDHS today in junior action while the midgets and seniors visit the always-tough Nelson Lords tomorrow in Burlington.
