In spite of a good deal of democratic lobbying by church groups, municipalities and many other groups in our society concerned about the quality of our lives, the question of Sunday shopping is not settled. When the decision is made one way or the other in our community I hope that the Christian point of View is considered.

As a Christian minister I cannot debate the economic advantages or disadvantages of Sunday shopping. I would hope that the economics of the question would only be one element of the debate. Other elements could be the quality of our family lives and the quality and opportunities for community life that a common day of rest provides. It might surprise some to learn that as a Christian I am not arguing for the sabbath day of rest in the Old Testament. This is the Jewish day of rest on Saturdays. The Lord's Day is the first day of the week, it is Sunday. Sunday is the day that Jesus rose again from the dead. It is resurrection day, and has been celebrated by Christians for almost 2,000 years. This is the central element in our faith, it is the hope of everlasting life that Christians proclaim.

Starting on Easter morning and ending this year on May 14 Christians are celebrating the Easter Season. It is also spring and the two events go well together. It is a time to celebrate new birth and beginnings. Life after the death of winter. Every Sunday is an Easter Sunday and this focus on new birth and new beginnings continues throughout the year. Christians would argue that Sunday is a day to re-create to rebuild things. To rebuild family relationships, to rebuild friendships, to rebuild communities. A time to walk in parks, take advantage of recreational activities, work around the garden. We believe that Jesus began something new on that first Sunday. We have the opportunity to share in the process everyday but especially on that special day of renewal called Sunday.


In addition to the potential recognition to be accorded winners, there will be \$500 in prize monies to be awarded for painting, drawing, sculpting and printmaking.






