From geology to painting the landscape is artist's life

What makes a man take a Gargantuan leap from geology, the science, to the free-spirited world of the painter?

It's simple, according to painter Mel Ferguson, whose works are on display at the Halton Hills Cultural Centre beginning this week. Mr. Ferguson's landscapes will be on display until May 23.

Mr. Ferguson's life has been devoted to the study of landscape. He is even employed part-time as a

landscaper. But before now the artist has taught school, been an active geologist and now would like to settle into the confortable niche of a commissioned painter.

The artist can explain his style by offering a few pieces of his history.

"In high school, I studied from hand-perspective drawing. Later, I used aerial photographs when I was employed as a geologist." The photographs were used to interpret

geological structures and to produce geological maps.

Mr. Ferguson is the president and charter member of the Brockville Artists' Studio and Gallery. He is a Windsor native who attended the University of New Brunswick, where he received a degree in geology. He spent seven years doing aerial mapping in Labrador, Newfoundland and the northern parts of Ontario and Quebec.

From his Brockville home where he paints from his studio, Mr. Ferguson can spend over 15 hours painting landscapes and historical buildings.

"I travel a lot of the country roads surrounding Brockville for materials," he said.

But spending time in the northern climes have left him with a wistfully pining for more of the great outdoors. "It's my intention, when I get rich enough, to go back there and paint one day," he said.

In addition to obtaining a horticulture degree, Mr. Ferguson attended the College of Education and taught in high schools in Morrisburg, Lucknow, Midland and Brockville.

- During this time he took private lessons in oil painting, pen and ink drawing and also studied at the St. Lawrence College in Brockville. His work was shown at the Westport Art Show for three years and has won awards. His works were auctioned off at the Watertown, New York Art Show on several occasions.

Mr. Ferguson's show opened May 2, featuring landscapes and buildings, including "Once Upon a Farm," a scene painted north of Brockville.
