
Big Chill II on June 3rd

SIN number needed for summer jobs

I am a 13 year old student and this year I want to get a summer job. I have been working for the past few, years delivering newspapers, baby-sitting and doing odd jobs in my neighborhood. This year I'd like to get a better job but was told that I need a Social Insurance Number. How can I get one?

Dear SINdy.

A Social Insurance Number is a nine digit number used in the ad-

ministration of various Canadian government programs. The first digit identifies the region of origin. The last digit is a check digit based on the others and the middle digits are simply in numerical sequence.

Usually it is the person to whom the card is issued who decides when to give the number out. You are not obliged to disclose it to anyone other than the federal government departments who have proper authority. The only other exception is employers who will need the number when they hire you.

How to apply for an original Social Insurance Number (SIN):

 Go to your nearest Canada Employment Centre and complete an application form (EMP 2120). The form must be typewritten or neatly done in ink.

2. Submit one primary document (ex. birth certificate, baptismal certificate, citizenship card or a Canadian passport).

3. Submit a secondary document (ex. drivers licence, school report, membership cards) if the name you are now using is the same as the name shown on your primary document.

4. Submit a supporting document, if the name on your primary document differs from the one you are now using. Some examples of these would be official documents dealing with your name being changed by law or your name being changed

ed by use.

Once your application is sent in and the information that you have provided is verified, it takes approximately three to four weeks before a SIN card is mailed to you. However, you should know that it is an offence to apply knowingly for more than one Social Insurance Number.

Once you get your Social Insurance Number you can then apply for a job. You can also come to the Canada Employment Centre for Students at 232 Guelph St. for any assistance you need in your summer job search. Our phone numbers are 877-7797 or 877-7751 and we are open Mondays to Fridays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
