

Careless use of firearm

Halton Regional Police laid charges of careless use of firearms following the shooting of a pellet gun. A 15-year-old Georgetown youth allegedly shot a pellet gun at another Georgetown youth, aged 16, May 13 at 4:30 p.m. on Pennington Crescent. No injuries resulted from the incident.

Police laid charges of theft in connection with the theft of seven packages of cigarettes from the A and P store at 100 Sinclair Ave. by a 15-year-old Georgetown youth that occurred on the same date. A July 3 court date has been scheduled in connection with both incidents.

Charged with possession

Two marijuana cigarettes were confiscated from a Georgetown man after he was arrested for intoxication in a public place and brought into Halton Police Department, 11 Division, during the evening of May 12. Police have laid charges of possession of a narcotics in connection with the incident. June 12 has been set as the court date.

Cigarette theft worth \$3300

Police say someone stole 100 cartons of cigarettes valued at \$3,300 from the rear storage area of the Main Variety and Grocery Store at 64 Main St. in Georgetown sometime between the afternoon and late evening of May 11. As well, a \$100 bill was stolen from a wallet.

Charges laid at club

Charges of mischief and theft were laid following an incident of Club 2000 in Norval, during the late evening of May 12. Police say a 22-year-old Georgetown man reportedly jumped on the hood of an 1984 Pontiac causing \$500 in damages. The same man was also allegedly in possession of a men's black leather jacket. A June 19 court date has been scheduled in connection both incidents.

Impaired driving charge

Police laid charges of impaired driving after a 25-year-old Hornby man was pulled over for apparently driving erratically on Guelph Street near Albert Street in Georgetown during the early morning of May 14. A court date was scheduled for May 15.

Theft, impaired charges laid

Police say a 35-year-old Barrie man allegedly stole a squeegee valued at \$5 from the Canadian Tire Gas Bar on Guelph Street in Georgetown May 13 at 2:15 a.m. The man was pulled over at the intersection of Guelph Street and Hall Road and found to be intoxicated. Charges of theft and impaired driving have been laid. May 15 was set as a bail hearing date.

Traffic violation

Charges of impaired driving were laid after police stopped a 36-year-old Bramalea man at the intersection of Queen Street and Churchill Boulevard in Acton during the early morning of May 14. Police say the man was pulled over for a Highway Traffic Act violation. Police say June 5 has been scheduled as the court date.

Rock thrown through window

Police say someone threw a rock through a bedroom window on Delrex Boulevard during the early morning of May 14. Police say the window was found broken after the complainant awoke to a loud bang sound. Damage to the window is estimated to be \$200.

Car window smashed

The driver's side window of a 1978 Toyota was smashed sometime between the late afternoon of May 13 and the next morning while it was parked outside a Kingham Rd. residence in Acton, police say. Damage is estimated at \$150.

Auto stolen

Police say a 1978 Chevrolet valued at \$3,000 was stolen from the MacDonald's Restaurant at 185 Guelph St. May 14 sometime between 7 p.m. and 8:15 p.m., while the owner was in the restaurant. The vehicle was apparently unlocked at the time of the incident, police say.

Woman treated for injuries

A 21-year-old Norval woman was treated for minor injuries at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after her 1982 Oldsmobile struck a hydro pole on Winston Churchill Boulevard south of Sideroad 10 in Halton Hills, police say. The woman was travelling southbound on Winston Churchill Blvd. when she pulled her vehicle to the right to avoid the high beams of an oncoming automobile. Police say that nothing is known about the other vehicle to this date. Charges of failure to change the address on the vehicle ownership papers were laid in connection with the incident.

Oakville man accused of fraud

Halton Regional Police are holding a Canada wide warrant for the arrest of an Oakville man who has been accused of defrauding a local car dealership by purchasing a vehicle valued at \$17,032 by tendering worthless cheques.

It is alleged that shortly after taking possession of the vehicle, in the month of April 1988, the wanted person was involved in a motor vehicle accident. The vehicle in question, bearing stolen licence plates, was seized and later returned to the dealership.

The wanted person, injured in the accident, fled the hospital before being contacted by the investigating officers.

Investigation revealed that the cheques used to purchase the vehicle had been stolen.

Officer fires shots

An off-duty Metro Police officer, fearful for his life, fired shots in an attempt to stop a 1989 Ford flatbed truck being driven towards him, sometime around 4 p.m., May 14 on Sideroad 5 near Tenth Line.

Constable Daniel Maille, of Mississauga, was uninjured and reported for duty the next day.

Halton Regional Police say Constable Maille followed the truck from Mississauga Road south of the 401 to Sideroad 5 at which time the truck was reversed towards Constable Maille's 1986 Pony. The constable was unable to move his vehicle out of the way and as a result the truck smashed into the automobile's front windshield forcing the car into a nearby ditch and Constable Maille to lie down on the car's front seat.

Police report the constable then got out of his car, identified himself as a police officer and walked in front of the truck asking the driver to stop. The vehicle reportedly lunged towards him at which time he fired his service revolver at the truck's front and back tires. However, police say the constable was unsuccessful in stopping the vehicle and it sped away eastbound on Sideroad 5.

Halton Regional Police recovered the vehicle a short time later on Emberton Road in Brampton.

Police are looking for a white male in his late 20s or early 30s who has short dark hair and a moustache.
