

Rebels to send 37 athletes to GHAC's

HIGH SCHOOL

Thirty-seven athletes will represent GDHS in 98 events at the GHAC track and field finals tomorrow in Hamilton.

The large Rebel representation came about after Georgetown swept to the men's, ladies' and overall titles at the annual Halton Finals in Burlington last Friday.

"It was an outstanding day," said GDHS head coach Bevin Clark. "We totally dominated things."

With a host of Georgetown athletes taking top three positions in the finals of several events at the Haltons, Clark admitted it was difficult to highlight any one individual performance.

"It's tough to single out an individual because there were so many strong performances," he said. Clark did cite veterans Glenn Mulder and Bob Donker on the boys side as well as ladies jumper Lisa Carter who participated despite battling a cold.

Scott Hobbs, Brent Couling, Dave Lawrence and Mike Dyer also had banner days for Georgetown. "Some midgets were just outstanding," added Clark.

As for the GHAC championships tomorrow which will determine who advances to the Regional Finals in Niagara Falls next Wednesday, Clark said the Rebels are ready.

"The Hamilton schools are tough," said Clark of tomorrow's expected competition. "But I can't see many schools coming in with our record. It's a nice way to go into something."

Redmen ready for Hamilton

Jennifer Scott will lead the Acton Redmen into the GHAC track and field finals tomorrow after superlative performance at the Haltons last week.

Scott struck gold in both the junior girls triple jump and long jump while mining silver in the javelin.

Seven other Redmen athletes and two relay teams will join Scott at the Hamilton-based GHACs.

Tanya Holley earned first place in the midget girls 100-metres and second in the 200; Tammy Richard was first in the midget girls discus and sixth in both the shot put and javelin; Tracy Hagan earned second in midget girls shot put, discus and high jump; Dave Osborne was third in the midget boys 800 and fifth in the 1500; and the junior girls 4x100 relay team took second in its final heat.

Other Redmen qualifiers include Troy Foster, fifth in senior boys long jump and triple jump; Heather Willmott, sixth in junior girls discus; and Matthew Elliott, sixth in midget boys 100 and 200, and seventh in the 400. Elliott advances to GHAC in the 400 after an opponent's scratch from the lineup moved him up into qualifying position (top six).

As well, the Redmen open girls 4x400 team will be trying its luck in Hamilton after claiming fourth at the Haltons in Burlington.
