As well, there are user fees, shorter interest-free grace periods and different ways of calculating interest. All this can be pretty confusing for people who use plastic to buy things. And I think that when inflation is around six per cent, companies which charge almost 30 per cent interest should come and let us know why.

So, starting June 12 my committee will start conducting hearings into credit cards, with witnesses coming from banks, consumer groups and retailers.

for the future is getting out, as they struggle against a dumb proposal for a new landfill site, and to change people's attitudes about waste.






