



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# BRIDGE



JAMES JACOBY

This deal would be dull if declarer had made all the tricks with a simple club finesse. But a crisscross squeeze? That makes headlines. Forget that an opening spade lead would be best for the defense — our West led the diamond six. Even so, declarer took his approach from the defensive signaling.

Declarer played jack from dummy and won East's queen with the ace. He played jack of hearts, finessing, and then a heart to dummy's queen, followed by the ace. East discarded the spade nine and the club nine, apparently showing strength in both suits. Declarer believed him. He cashed the heart 10, came to his hand with the diamond king and played his last heart, throwing away dummy's queen of clubs. He then played three more diamonds, discarding his two small spades. That left South with the spade ace and the J-7 of clubs; dummy had Q-5 of spades and the club ace. And what would you have East hold? If East blanked the spade king, declarer would play to his spade ace and return to dummy's club ace to cash the good spade queen. If East unguarded the club king, declarer would play the club ace and come to his hand with the spade ace for the good club jack.

What if East had simply played low cards in both black suits early? Probably South would simply have taken a club finesse to make only 12 tricks. But note that East might have flagged the club nine without holding the king. That type of deception is part of the game.
