

Three car collision

Halton Regional Police have laid charges of turning left across the path of another vehicle in connection with a three-car collision on Guelph Street south of Wildwood Road in Halton Hills the evening of May 23. A 51-yearold Acton woman driving a 1989 Pontiac pulled in front of a 1983 Pontiac driven by a Georgetown woman, 22, causing it to slide into another vehicle, a 1974 Pontiac, driven by a 20-year-old Acton man. No injuries were reported and damages to the vehicles ranged from minimal to moderate.

Two car collision

Charges of making an improper turn were laid following a two-vehicle collision on Maple Avenue east of Main Street in Halton Hills during the early morning of May 28. Police say a Brampton man, driving a 1982 Buick westbound on Maple Avenue attempted to make a Uturn after having stopped for traffic ahead, when his vehicle was struck by a 1962 Chrysler driven by a 51-year-old Georgetown resident. An 81-yearold Georgetown woman riding in the Chrysler was taken to: Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital and treated for minimal injuries.

Minimal injuries

A Georgetown man, 54, was treated for minimal injuries at the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital and his 1980 Ford was severely damaged following a two-car collision at the intersection of Fifth Line and Sideroad 10 during the early morning of May 25. The man allegedly did not stop at a stop sign, rolling through the intersection, striking a 1984 Ford, driven by a 19-year-old Milton man. He was uninjured while his vehicle was severely damaged.

Charges laid

Police have laid charges of not giving the right of way in connection with a two-car collision at Mountainview Road South and Guelph Street during the early morning of May 25. A 1987 Mercury, driven by a 50-year-old

Glen Williams man, travelling southbound on Mountainview Road was struck by a Hillburgh man, 40, who was pulling out of a private entrance on Mountainview Road South in a 1989 Chevrolet.

Minor injuries

A Georgetown man, 36, was taken to Georgetown hospital and treated for minimal injuries following a collision at the Mountainview Road North and Armstrong Avenue intersection, the afternoon of May 24. Police say the man's vehicle, travelling northbound in the passing lane of Mountainview Road, was struck when a 1984 Nissan, driven by a 30-year-old Georgetown woman, was making a left turn off of Armstrong Avenue. Police have laid charges of failing to stop in connection with the incident.

Impaired charges

Charges of impaired driving have been laid after police found a 40-year-old Mississauga man behind the wheel of a vehicle parked in the parking lot located in the area of Highway 7 and Sixth Line during the late evening of May 21. A June 26 court date has been scheduled in connection with the incident.

Spot check

Police have laid impaired driving charges as a result of a spot check at Guelph Street near Delrex Boulevard the night of May 27. A 44-year-old Hamilton man is scheduled to appear in court May 26.

Cash stolen

Police say someone stole \$300 in cash from an open safe in the backroom of a Georgetown delicatessen on Main Street sometime during the early afternoon of May 26.

Bottle thrown

The passenger of a vehicle threw an empty beer bottle through the rear window of a 1977 Ford causing \$300 in damages at the corner of Main Street and Maple Avenue in Georgetown the evening of May 26, police say. No injuries were reported.

Mischief charges

Police have laid charges of public mischief in connection with a crank call received May 10. Police responded to a call made on the emergency 911 line

in which a break and entry was reported to be going on at an Acton house. But when they arrived at the scene, the home's owner had no idea why the officers were called. Further investigation resulted in the arrest of an 18year-old Acton man. A June 26 court date has been scheduled.

Window smashed

Police say the window of M.Z. Bennett Middle School on Acton Boulevard in Acton was smashed sometime between the evening of May 26 and early the next morning. Damage is estimated to be

Mower stolen

Someone stole a gas power mower, tool box and tools totalling \$750 from an unlocked backyard shed in the Calvert Drive area sometime between the afternoon of May 20 and May 22, police say.

Theft charges

Charges of theft under \$1,000 were laid after merchandise totalling \$40 was reported stolen from Miracle Food Mart at 235 Guelph St. in Georgetown sometime during the early morning of May 25. A 33-year-old Georgetown woman is scheduled to appear in court June 19 in connection with the incident.

Jaguar damaged

A \$500 hood ornament was removed from a 1985 Jaguar parked at a Mountainview Road car dealership sometime overnight May 19, police say.

Failing to stop

Police laid charges of failing to stop in connection with a two-car collision that occurred at Main Street North and Highway 25. A 1976 Volvo driven by a 30-year-old Acton woman was southbound on Highway 25 when it failed to stop at the intersection, striking a 1967 Hyundai driven by a 19-year-old Rockwood woman.

Hydro pole down

A hydro pole was pulled down by a 1984 Mack truck driver from Fort Lauderdale, Florida at the intersection of Young Street and Arthur Street in Acton the morning of May 4. Police say the westbound truck's load got caught in hydro cables. There was no damage to the truck.

Cigarettes stolen CRIME STOPPERS from Burlington Beckers store


Halton police in Burlington are requesting assistance in identifying three males who attempted to rob the Beckers store at 5111 New Street of a quantity of cigarettes.

At 5 p.m. on Friday, February 17, 1989, two males entered the Beckers store, and while the lone female clerk was kept busy one suspect entered the storage area by an open door. After letting a third suspect into the store by the rear door he returned to the front and along with the second male attempted to distract the clerk.

The clerk noticed that the door to the storage room was now closed and when she entered to investigate she was pushed to the floor and all three suspects ran from the store.

A short while later suspect No. 3 was seen on Appleby Line south of New Street by a patrolling officer but was lost after a short chase through the rear yards.

The suspects are described as: 1. Male, white, 25-30 years, heavy build, brown curly hair to below his ears, brown medium



moustache, pock marked face, wearing blue bomber jacket and jeans.

2. Male, white, 25-30 years, medium build, medium blond hair, worn long in back, clean shaven, wearing a maroon colored jacket.

3. Male, white, 19-23 years, medium build, blue/grey eyes, dirty blond neat hair parted in middle and feathered, wearing a knee length brown overcoat, jeans and white running shoes.

Crime Stoppers will pay up to \$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest in this case or any other case. Callers are not required to reveal their identities or testify in court. The Crime Stoppers toll free number is 1-800-668-5151.
