of Resident Care at the centre.

The nursing home offers extended care while the retirement home is for those who can care for themselves, "and are able to make rational decisions," said Ms. Herbert.

The Region report supports these figures. The report says there will be greater need for extended care for seniors in the future.

The Regional report also says that income affects how soon a person leaves their home to go to an institution.

And financial status is "one of the most influential factors affecting the older person's he lth," says the r port.

"It may be that this factor plays a great role in enabling these individuals to r main in their homes, in the community."

"Most people would like to stay in their own homes as long as they

can," said Ms. Herbert. She said services such as those offered by the Red Cross, the Victorian Order of Nurses and Halton Helping Hands allow people to remain in their homes while receiving extended care.

Halton Region will use the report published as a result o an Elderly Services Advisory Committee (ESAC) mandate as a source in determining future changes in services to the elderly.

There is presently one Regional seniors facility located in Milton. Halton Centennial Manor serves the Region's four municipalities.

"It is interesting to note Halton Hills is the home to more senior citizens (2,806) than Milton (2,279) yet it has no chronic care facilities," the Regional report says.

Ms. Herbert said the Bennett Centre will "hopefully" get facilities in the near chronic future.
