Immunization clinic

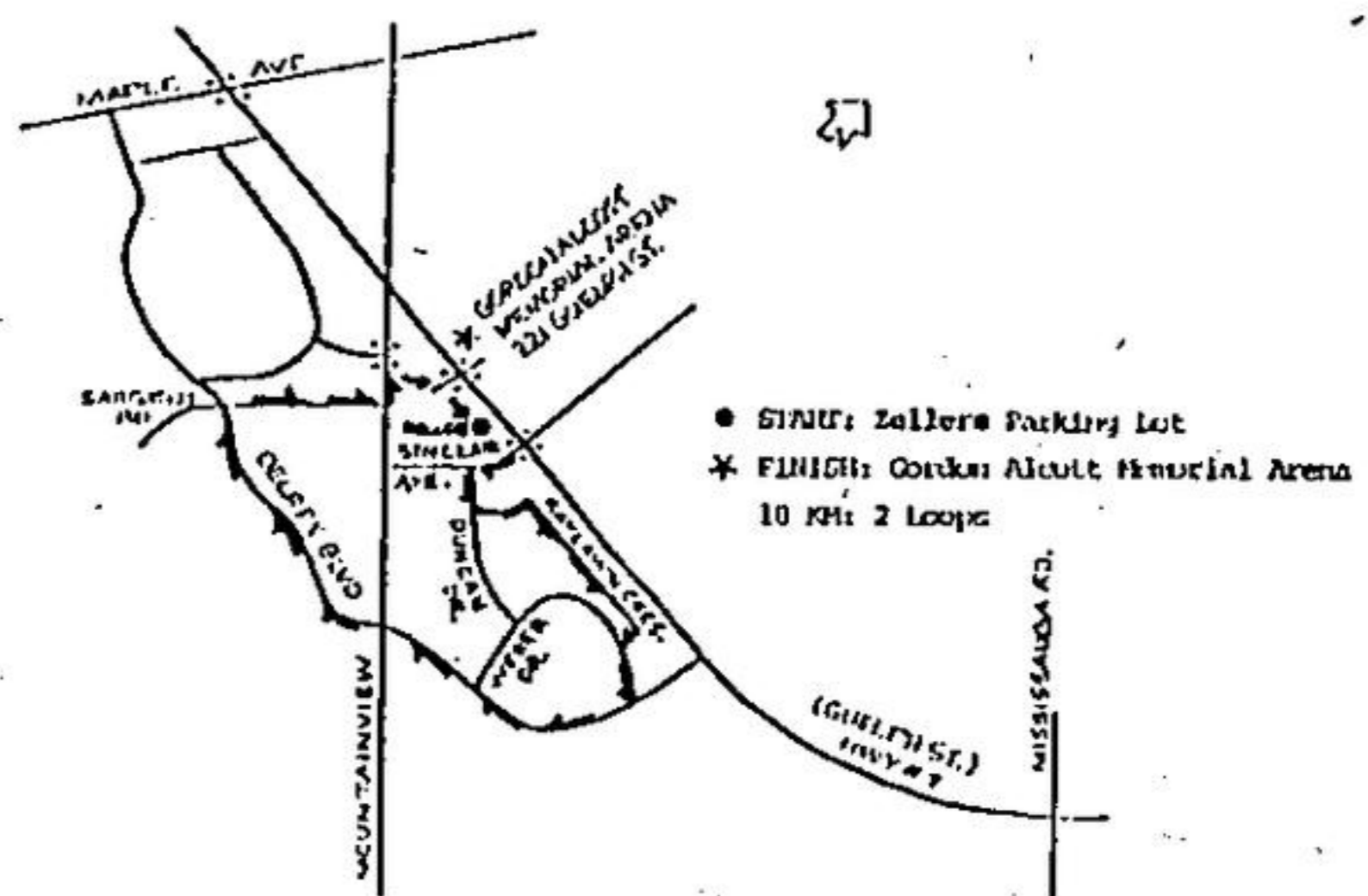

Safety For The Runners

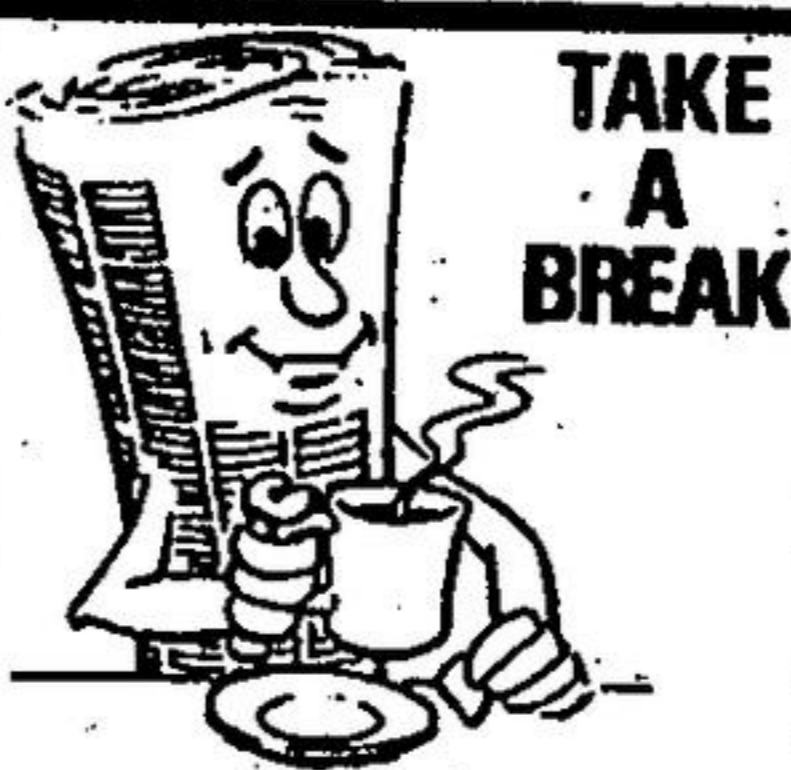

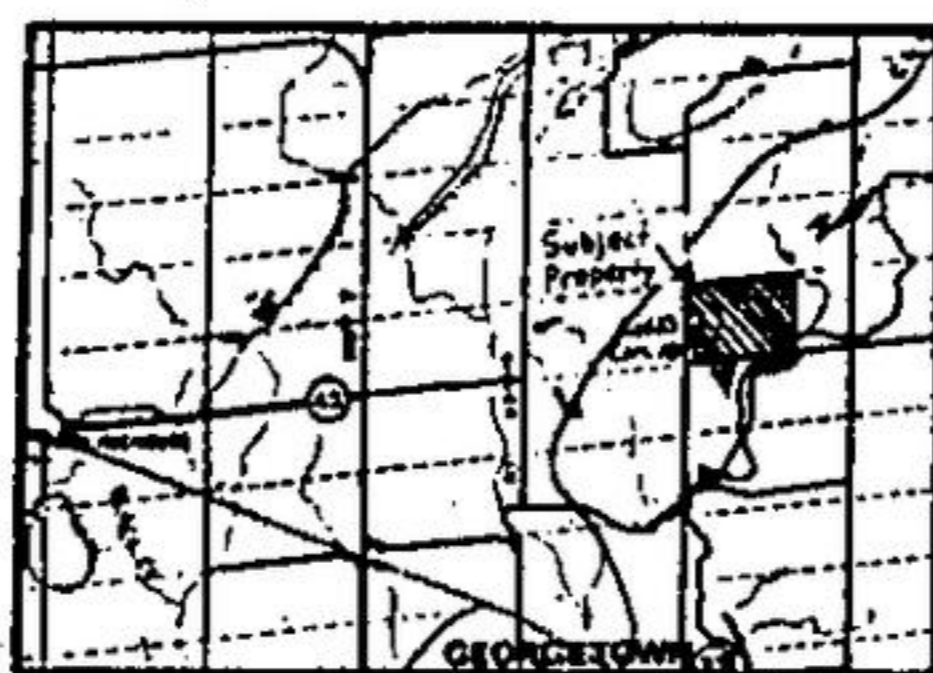
