Judy Collins' voice is still strong and rich

Judy Collins learned to read music before she could read words.

A child prodigy, she was trained as a classical pianist. It was as a singer and songwriter, however, that she rose to prominence during the "protest era" - the 1960s - when she and a number of other folk singers were active in the civil rights movement.

Collins, who just turned 50, has produced a number of major hits, including *Someday Soon*, *Send in the Clowns* and *Both Sides Now*.

In a one-hour special that makes its Canadian TV premiere on the Family Channel June 8, Collins reflects back on her life and sings some of her ballads that became classics.

Judy Collins: *Going Home*, filmed for the Disney Channel in the U.S., was taped at a family reunion and at a concert at Wheeler Opera House.

There are a few reunion scenes, but the special is built around the concert. Collins' voice is still strong and rich - and she still pours her feelings into the songs.

In *Limbo*, a drama that airs June 22 on CBC-TV, centres on a woman's struggle to adapt to a new country and to regain confidence in herself.

Pajendra was a successful doctor in Sri Lanka. Now, she tries to "fit into" a new job and a new land - and to relearn how to trust other people.

In *Limbo* is part of the CBC's *Inside Stories* anthology.

Speed limit not reduced

Despite objections from local Councillor Alf Spence, a one-mile stretch of road on Ninth Line will not get a speed reduction to 60 km-h.

The road between Wildwood Road and Concession 26 in Glen Williams is presently at 80 km-h. But "anyone who would do 80 kilometres on that road should have some kind of examination," said Coun. Spence Monday night.

Coun. Spence asked councillors to consider giving an engineering report back to town staff for reconsideration, but Halton Hills Mayor Russ Miller said the road speed would either be made as "a political decision" then and there, or the engineer's report would be accepted.

Town engineer Bob Austin said the road was examined and it was determined that under good conditions, a driver could travel at 80 km-h.

"Even with no shoulders (on the road), the number of entrances and the amount of traffic, the road surface when it's good, warrants the 80 km-h speed limit," said Mr. Austin.

Alzheimer Society to launch new patient register program

The Alzheimer Society will be launching their Halton Wandering Patient Registry on June 14 at the Acton Social Services and Information Centre, "The Old Town Hall," 19 Willow Street North, Acton. Families who have a relative with Alzheimer's Disease or related disorder living in this community are urged to register.

The program was developed by the Alzheimer Society for Halton-Wentworth and the Halton Regional Police Force and operated in conjunction with the Acton Social Services and Information Centre and community volunteers.

At an appointment, arranged in advance, a family member accompanies the memory-impaired wandering person to the centre to answer questions about personal

and individual characteristics of the registrant. - A polaroid photograph of each registrant will be taken. Photos and information, computerized by the police, will be available in a search through individual registration file numbers, quoted by the family when reporting the patient as missing. Files are updated as needed, at least on a yearly basis.
