Dave Ridley made an excellent catch to end one Clarkson rally and


Valk and Doyle pitched well for Georgetown.

Facilities available

Now, if you can find a home suitable that has an income with it, you can expect that a great percentage of your mortgage payment will be offset with your additional income. Fortunately, in Georgetown and Acton, we have a very limited number of rental units, so vacancy rates are almost nil. What a boost to finally know that it is possible to own your own home - and what an investment it is.

After you have your foot on the first rung of the ladder, it is easy after that. It is only the initial step that is the hardest - but there are lots of trained people out there to help you make wise decisions - and I know that you will be glad that you bit the bullet while the odds were with you. Start small, and before you know it, you will be advising others how to do it.
