For three days this week Halton Hills residents will be able to step into the past for the annual Pioneer Days celebration downtown Georgetown.

The celebration kicks off Thursday with a sidewalk sale starting at 9:30 a.m. Other events throughout the day include a seniors awareness display, a bake sale and a patio garden at the McGibbon Hotel. For mechanically minded people a 1920 Goodison steam engine will be on display and for the kids, Dr. Bandoli's "Ghostbuster Ambulance" lookalike and the Travelling Goodtime show will be on hand at 11 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.

The Mad Dr. Bee rubber animal petting zoo opens at 3:30 p.m. The opening ceremonies kick off at 7 p.m. with a special performance by the Pine Valley Squares followed by dancing in the street to the tunes of Barbara Dowdell and Friends on the patio.

Also on display Thursday are model steam engines and a ropemaking demonstration on a machine by Jack Layman.

Jack Armstrong will have his 1932 Chevrolet on display and Penniesworth will hand out its Youngest Pioneer Award to the first baby born during Pioneer Days sometime during the weekend.

The Georgetown Lioness Club hosts its Lifestyles '89 Auction at 11 and registration for the Halton Hills Recreation Depart-




ment's Parade of Decorated Bicycles at Memorial Park opens at noon. The parade will get under way,at 12:30 p.m.
