### Two-car collision

Halton Regional Police have laid charges of making an improper turn following a two-car collision on Guelph Street east of Edward Street, Saturday afternoon. Police say a Hamilton man, 22, travelling westbound in a 1980 Chevrolet turned into the path of a westbound 1984 Chevrolet driven by a 39-year-old Brampton woman, while attempting to move from the passing to the curb lane.

# Single-car accident

Police say the car flipped over landing on its roof in a ditch on the opposite side of the road. The driver was treated at Georgetown hospital and released hours later.

#### Girl treated

Charges of going through a red light were laid following the collision of a 1981 Chevrolet and a 1988 Volkswagen at the Guelph Street and Mountainview Road intersection in Georgetown, late Sunday afternoon, Police say a 5-year-old Halton Hills girl, a passenger in the Chevrolet, was treated for minor injuries at Georgetown hospital following the accident. The Volkswagen, driven by a Georgetown man, 35, was severely damaged, police say. The Chevrolet, driven by a 47-yearold Halton Hills man was moderately damaged.

# Minor injuries

Police say a 1979 Ford, driven by a 24-year-old Georgetown woman, was demolished as the result of a two-car collision on Delrex Boulevard in Halton Hills last Friday afternoon. The vehicle's two passengers, a 21-year-old and 24-year-old woman, were treated for minor injuries at Georgetown hospital following the incident. The other vehicle involved in the accident, a 1982 Mercury, was moderately damaged. Charges of not giving the right of way were laid, police say.

### Guitar stolen

Police say someone stole a Yahama guitar from Georgetown's Centennial Public School's music room, sometime last Thursday. The room is reportedly open to all students during school hours. The guitar's value was not given.

# Window smashed

Someone smashed the window of a Delrex Boulevard variety store in Georgetown causing \$300 in damages Saturday night, police say. The store's manager reportedly told police there were a group of youths outside the store before the incident occurred. The manager heard a crash and when he went outside to investigate, he discovered the broken window.

#### Stereo stolen

Police say three vehicles parked outside a welding shop on the Eighth Line south of Maple Avenue in Georgetown, were broken into sometime this past weekend. Stolen were a \$700 AM/FM car stereo from a 1966 Western Star Truck; a \$150 CB radio from a 1960 Freightliner Transport Truck; and a \$300 CB radio from a 1960 GMC Dump Truck. All the drivers' doors of the three vehicles were forced open, police say.

# Tapes stolen

domestic situation, occurring early Friday morning. Police say a 28-year-old Georgetown woman punched another Georgetown woman, 31, in the nose, knocking the woman to the ground, after seeing the woman walking with her common law husband. A July 16 court date has been scheduled.

# \$10,000 damage

Halton Regional Police have laid charges of mischievousness,

break and entering, theft, and wilfull damage in connection with \$10,000 in damages caused to a Georgetown construction site on Armstrong Avenue sometime between May 5 and May 8. Three Georgetown youths, two of whom are 15 years old and one, who is 14, were arrested June 16 in connection with the incident, police say. A September 15 court date has been scheduled. No property reportedly stolen from the site has been recovered.

# Motel robbers sought by police

Crime Stoppers of Halton and the Halton Regional Police in Burlington are looking for two men who robbed the desk clerk at the Journey's End Motel in Burlington, at gunpoint. This robbery took place at 12:35 a.m., Wednesday, May 31, 1989.

Two male suspects entered the motel and approached the front desk. One of the suspects asked the female clerk where the phone was. When the clerk directed him towards the pay phone, both suspects quickly went behind the desk. One man produced a handgun and placed it at the head of the clerk, grabbing her arm. The second suspect emptied both cash registers of cash and \$100 in wrapped coin. The clerk was pushed against the wall with the gun still to her head. She was then forced to the floor and told to stay there for 10 minutes or she was dead. Both suspects then fled.

Descriptions of the suspects




