ASSIC director appointed to Halton Housing Authority

The director of the Acton Social Services and Information Centre has been appointed to the Halton Housing Authority.

Peggy Balkind, of Acton, was officially informed in June by Minister of Housing Chaviva Hosek, that she would be one of a seven-member team managing low-cost housing in Halton.

"The whole issue of housing is so important," said Mrs. Balkind. 'We need more low-cost housing, and since I'm located here (in Halton Hills), that's my prime interest."

Mrs. Balkind sald that her work in social services has shown her the great need for affordable hous-

"We deal in housing here at the ASSIC all the hime," she said. But the position of housing authority member will be strictly on a volunteer basis, and is unrelated to her work at the ASSIC.

Georgetown has been approved

for 40 low-cost units to be built on Carruthers Road. Acton should soon follow suit with "25 to 30 units," said Mrs. Balkind.

There are over 1,000 government assisted housing units in Burlington, Halton Hills, Oakville and Milton, according to a release by the Ministry of Health.

These units will be managed by

the Halton Housing Authority, under a chairperson chosen by the province.

Golf club stolen


