

# Acton track busy as local schools kick up dust

## Bad inning spoils Hoosiers title bid

One bad inning eliminated the Halton Hills Firestone Hoosiers from the Peewee Girls Softball Tournament last week, in Fergus. The locals had won their first game, to move into the championship round. But the team from Guelph, which the Hoosiers had beaten the previous year in the championship game, avenged that loss and eliminated Firestone from the tournament.

Firestone opened the tournament with an 8 a.m. game with Arthur. They scored four runs in the first and eight in the third as Halton Hills cruised to an easy 14-4 win.

Playing as the visiting team, the Hoosiers opened the game with a flourish. A single by Tammy Richards drove in the first run. Sherie Peacock followed with an RBI ground-out. And one batter later, Wendy Graham cashed two more runners with a double. It was 4-0.

In the second, Amy Korzack drew a leadoff walk and scored on a Heather Bailey single. And in the third, Firestone erupted for eight runs, with the big blow being a three-run triple into the left-centre field gap by Shannon Morris.

Natalie Cameron led the team with three runs scored. Morris and Andrea Leeking combined on a no-hitter, with Morris picking up the victory with three innings of no-run, seven-strikeout work.

The morning success put them up against Guelph in the afternoon

contest. Again playing as visitors, the Hoosiers broke the ice first, scoring three runs in the top of the second, to take a 3-0 lead. Peacock singled to open the inning. Julie Scarlett worked a walk. Then Cameron cranked a three and two pitch over the left fielder for a bases-clearing homer.

The wheels came off for the locals in the bottom of the third. After a leadoff strikeout, Guelph beat out a pair of hits that never left the infield. That unsettled the pitcher, Morris, who tried to throw it even harder. Unfortunately, she lost command of the strike zone, and walked a pair. Then a pickoff attempt was thrown into left field, allowing more runs to score, and the route was on. At inning's end, the opposition had scored 11 runs on only three singles. The Hoosiers had contributed three errors and nine walks to Guelph's cause.

Firestone set the Guelph team down one, two, three over the next two innings, and managed to get one run closer, when Lisa Harlow scored on a double by Bailey in the fifth. But that was as close as they could come. Final score: 11-4.

Morris took the loss, allowing four hits and striking out nine in four and a third innings. Richards relieved in the third, allowing three walks and striking out two. The Hoosiers out-hit Guelph 6-4. Stacey Colarossi led the team in hits, with two.
