

Six thefts

Halton Regional Police report there were six thefts from vehicles all parked in the area of MacIntyre Crescent in Georgetown sometime early Saturday morning. Personal and ownership papers were stolen from a 1975 Buick, 1960 AMC, 1983 Mazda, and 1984 Plymouth. Police say all vehicles were unlocked at the time of the thefts. The contents stolen from each car are valued at approximately

A baseball glove, sunglasses and a set of house keys were stolen from an unlocked 1984 Chevrolet. The stolen property is valued at \$80. Four car stereo speakers with a total value of \$100 were stolen from an unlocked 1975 Ford.

As well, someone stole a \$150 C.B. radio from an unlocked 1984 Pontiac that was parked in the Eden Place area of Georgetown, sometime early Friday morning, police say.

Rim stolen

Police say a tire rim valued at approximately \$100 was stolen from a 1981 Volkswagen Rabbit, parked on Main Street in Glen Williams sometime between the late evening of June 29 and early the next morning.

Impaired charges

Police stopped a 28-year-old Acton, woman at the Queen Street-Acton Boulevard intersection after observing her driving erratically westbound on Queen Street early Saturday morning. Charges of impaired driving were laid in connection with the incident. A July 31 court date has been scheduled.

Mail boxes smashed

Police say there has been a rash of mail box vandalism in the north end of Milton and, outskirts of Acton. The latest reports of this type of vandalism occurred in the area of Lot 32 and Concession 5 in Acton when two mail boxes apparently were smashed by someone in a passing vehicle. sometime between the evening of June 29 and the next morning. Police say a baseball bat or some other piece of wood was used to damage the mail boxes. The two were valued at \$65 and \$85, respectively.

Spray gun stolen

Someone cut off the spray gun of a garden hose located in the backyard of an Alexander Crescent home in Georgetown sometime overnight of June 30. The stolen property is valued at \$15.

Charges laid

Charges of impaired driving were laid following a spot check at the intersection of Maple Avenue and Main Street in Georgetown, Friday night. A 34-year-old Georgetown man is scheduled to appear in court July 31 in connection with the incident.

Man charged

Police have laid charges of impaired driving after pulling over a 30-year-old Georgetown man for a Highway Traffic Act violation at Church and Main Streets, early Friday morning.

Assault charges

Police say a 48-year-old Georgetown man allegedly punched his wife and pulled her hair erarly Saturday morning. The man is reported to have also pulled his daughter's hair and pushed her. Police report the incidents had occurred after the man returned home from an alleged "drinking session." Other members of the family had also allegedly been drinking before the incident happened. Two charges of assault have been laid in connection with the domestic situation, as well a July 24 court date has been scheduled.

Window smashed

A window of a 1977 Chevrolet valued at \$150 was smashed while parked outside a Charles Street home in Georgetown sometime between the late evening of June 30 and the next morning.

\$3,000 damage

Police laid charges of dangerous operation of a motor vehicle after the front window of the Time Out Roadhouse on Guelph Street in Georgetown was smashed early Sunday morning. Police say a 19-year-old Campbellville woman and a 20-year-old Halton Hills woman were operating a 1986 Pontiac when the vehicle went out of control and smashed into the window, causing approximately \$3,000 in damages. Police say one woman was operating the gas and brake pedals from the passenger seat while the other was steering when the incident occurred.

Car demolished

Halton Regional Police say a 1973 Plymouth was demolished after the vehicle left Trafalgar Road north of Sideroad 10 in Halton Hills and landed in a ditch, sometime June 25. The driver of the northbound vehicle is unknown, police say.

Car-bike collision

A 7-year-old Acton boy was treated for minimal injuries at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after his bicycle and a 1977 Oldsmobile collided on the Fifth Line north of Highway 7 late Sunday afternoon, police report. The boy was taken to the hospital by his parents. Police say the collision occurred when neither the cyclist, who was riding down a private drive, nor the driver of the westbound vehicle, an Acton male, saw each other.

\$800 damage

Police report a glass door window and two windows on the west side of St. Francis of Assisi school on Duncan Drive in Georgetown, were smashed sometime between Saturday night and the next morning. Damages were valued at \$800.

Cars collide

Charges of following too closely were laid after a two-car collision at the intersection of River Street and John Street in Halton Hills the evening of June 27. Police say a 1987 Ford driven eastbound on River Street by a 20-year-old Halton Hills woman was severely damaged when it collided with a 1982 Ford. The vehicle's driver, a 46-year-old Georgetown woman, was eastbound on the same street attempting to make a left turn, when the incident occurred.

Two-car collision

Police have laid charges of careless driving in connection with a two-vehicle collision on Winston Churchill Boulevard, one kilometre south of Sideroad 5 in Halton Hills last Thursday afternoon. A 26-year-old Georgetown man travelling northbound in a 1984 Mercury collided with the rear end of a stopped 1989 Ford. The Ford's driver, a 21-year-old Downsview man, had stopped to assist a pedestrian who had fallen in a ditch. The Mercury was severely damaged, police say.

Severe damage

Police say a 1977 Oldsmobile was severely damaged following a two-car collision at Trafalgar Road and Sideroad 5 in Halton Hills Sunday morning. A 64-yearold Mississauga man travelling northbound in the Oldsmobile was waiting to make a left-hand turn when a St. Catharines man, 16, travelling northbound in a 1988 Chevrolet attempted to pass him, resulting in a collision. Charges of making an improper lane change were laid following the incident.

Fail-to-yield charge

Police have laid charges of failure to yield after a stop following a two-car collision on the Eighth Line at Sideroad 10 in Halton Hills during the afternoon of June 24. A 1981 Pontiac driven by a 37-year-old Georgetown man, collided with a cyclist when the man left the stop sign on the Eighth Line and drove into the intersection. The cyclist, a 19-year-old Georgetown man, received minimal injuries.

Vandals cause \$4,000 damage to 10 vehicles in early June

Investigators with Halton Regional Police in Oakville are requesting the public's assistance in identifying the person(s) responsible for damage to numerous vehicles parked at 1032 Winston Churchill Boulevard.

During the weekend of June 3 to 4, 1989 approximately 10 vehicles parked at the above location were vandalized, resulting in \$4,000 damage being reported to the Regional Police. The damage to the vehicles consisted of smashed windshields, door windows and a slashed convertible roof.

Although suspects had entered and ransacked most of the damaged cars, the only reported theft is a Sansui cassette player,



Vandalism is the highest reported crime in Canada and in Oakville between January 1 and June 1 - there have been 496 reported incidents of wilful damage.
