

Police Beat

Impaired charge

Halton Regional Police stopped a 52-year-old Mississauga man for a traffic violation at Highway 25 and Sideroad 10 in Halton Hills early Tuesday morning. Charges of impaired driving were subsequently laid, police say. An Aug. 14 court date has been scheduled.

Man charged

A 42-year-old Georgetown man allegedly struck a woman on the mouth at a Mountainview Road North house in Georgetown late Monday evening, police say. The victim is a 41-year-old Georgetown resident. Police report there is apparently no relationship between the two people. The suspect is to appear in court Aug. 4.

\$400 damage

Someone reportedly entered an unlocked 1979 AMC causing extensive damage to the vehicle's dashboard and smashed the windshield at Trafalgar Road South and Sideroad 10 sometime between June 27 and this past Monday, police say. About \$400 in damages resulted.

Rock thrown

Police say someone threw a rock through the main door window of an Armstrong Avenue concrete company in Georgetown sometime between June 30 and July 1. About \$400 in damages resulted.

contribution to fighting the landfill site in 1989. They asked for continued commitment in fighting RSI's proposal.

At a Regional meeting in May, Halton Hills Mayor Russ Miller asked the Region to delay giving a response to the Ministry of the Environment until the town had a chance to consult with its lawyers.

The town's final decision asked the Region to "issue a ruling requiring RSI to conduct a proper environmental assessment before permitting this (landfill application) to proceed further."

Stereo stolen

Police are unsure how entry was gained to a Churchill Road house in Acton, in which \$700 worth of stereo equipment was stolen, sometime between the afternoon of July 1 and early the next morning.

Pellet holes

Someone used a pellet gun to shoot holes in six store front windows and a bay door window, causing \$2,000 in damages, at an Armstrong Avenue plaza in Georgetown sometime between June 29 and Tuesday, police say.

Door stolen

In a bizarre incident police report someone stole the driver's door of a 1979 Chevrolet parked outside an Armstrong Avenue garage in Georgetown sometime between July 3 and the next morning. The door was valued at \$200. Police suspect the door was unlocked at the time.

Money stolen

Someone stole \$20 worth of Canadian Tire co-op money from a unlocked 1980 Dodge parked outside a Sargent Road house in Georgetown sometime Monday, police say.

Charges laid

Charges of breaking and entering were laid in connection with a June 22 robbery from a Lot 23 and Concession 8 home, police say. A 14-year-old girl of no fixed address appeared for a bail hearing Wednesday. Stolen was some clothing, liquor and food stuffs with a total value of \$150.

Beaches sampled twice weekly

Halton Region's health department begins twice-weekly beach sampling this week that will include an "intensive survey" of the closed beach at Fairy Lake in Acton.

The Region samples 13 points at lakes and streams and does some spot sampling on the Credit River. The surveys, which began in June, produced four beach closures in south Halton.

The new beach at Fairy Lake, closed last year due to high bacterial counts, was sampled as early as May this year. Sampling will continue into August.

The Region has closed the Sioux Lookout and Burloak Park in Burlington, and Bronte Park West and Dingle Park in Oakville. Bronte Beach is the only one considered as a swimming beach, said Dave Stronach of the Region's health department.

The new beach at Fairy Lake and two private beaches at Prospect Park campgrounds in Acton are also closed.

The old beach at Fairy Lake remains open.

The Region says the objective of summer-long testing at Fairy Lake is to see how to reduce bacterial counts. Polluted waters are determined by the level of faecal coliform - "organisms found in the gut of warm-blooded beings."

The organisms don't necessarily carry disease, but they are a method of measuring pollution, said Mr. Stronach.

The new beach at Fairy Lake won't open until the Region determines that the bacterial count is at a safe level. The beach could be closed for much of the swimming season, which runs from July 3 to Aug. 27.

The Regional health staff suggested placing placards on tested beaches to warn that bacteria levels could increase and the beaches could close. The signs

would include a "beach hotline" number to call.

There are 10 sites in Burlington and Oakville where the beaches are tested. There are another three

sites in North Halton - Fairy Lake in Acton, Kelso Park in Milton and Coral Park in Campbellville. The Region also takes "spot samples" along the Credit River.

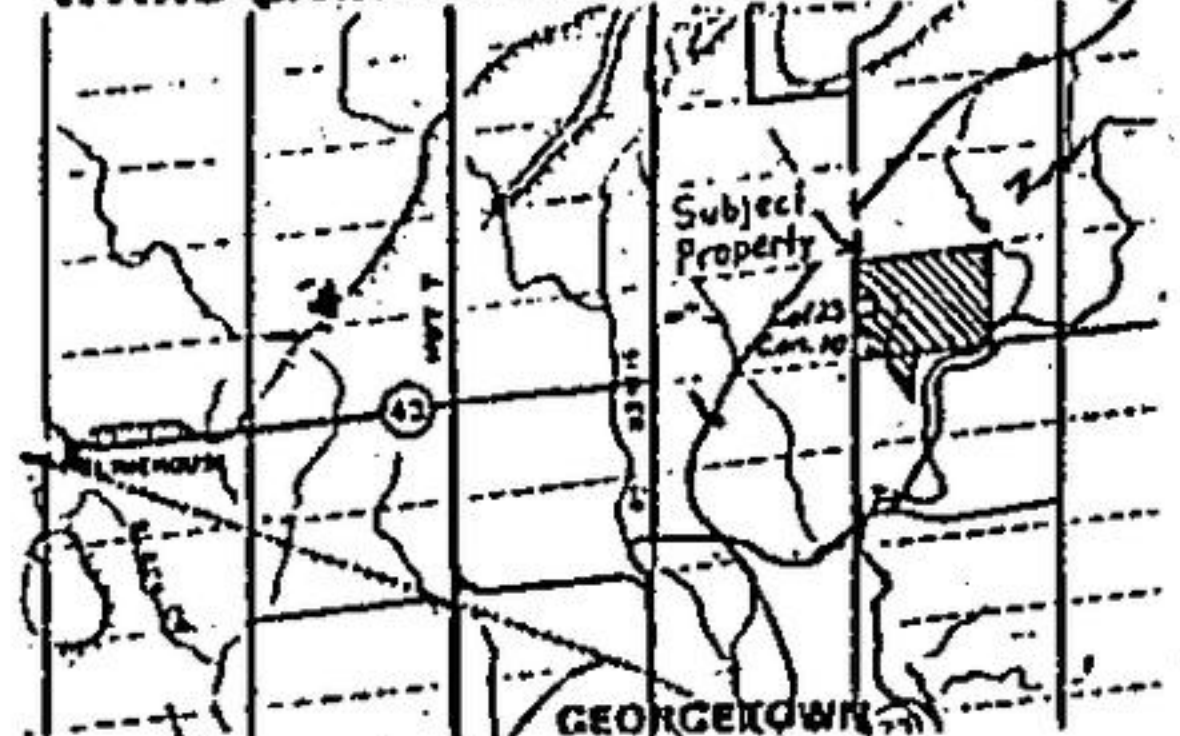
