

# True club system needs look

There has to be a place for house league style play, however I am not in favor of the two styles of registration, which gives us house league and competitive players. I watched a game last week at the youth age level and saw one team with eight players and the other with more than a full squad. Surely the object of the system is to teach the kids the skills and tactics of the game whilst, very importantly, giving them fun and exercise. Fun and exercise will not be achieved whilst sitting on the bench. There is substitution allowed and there are set times, locally, for substitution. Huge scores can be run up

when one team has a full, plus, squad and the other has less than the complement.

Players sign up or are signed up and then drafted to teams. It is not possible to have a full history of the player, with holiday times etc., in the profile. Coaches change with the age groups and the new man or woman will have a hard time choosing players.

On the other hand the competitive team coach is restricted to the players chosen for the duration of the season. There are, of course, circumstances allowing changes. However, each player registered as rep can be quite costly when changes are made, to the roster.

I believe all players should register to play in the club system, and play where the clubs feel fit. I also believe that the representative teams should be just as the word implies. Players should be chosen when they are able to play, based upon merit, at the time the games are scheduled. Just as national teams are chosen, or provincial, for that matter. The squad should be interchangeable as required by form, injury, availability etc.

South America, Brazil in particular, has given us much exciting soccer in the past 40 years or so.

Hopefully the newest trend will not catch on. A couple of players, now playing in Sweden, assaulted a referee during a recent game. The referee was left unconscious for a brief time after being kicked in the head. Four players were arrested in the full incident. In recent years, the violence attached to the game has been confined to the "fans" and although rising in England had moved around other European centres, sadly.

It is probably a sign of modern times which we live in, generally. Violence is the modern day curse.

Players should play the game. Officials should officiate. Administrators should administrate. And not interfere with tasks other than their own sphere of operations. At the same-time we should be looking to upgrade the standards of all.

The CSL's current leaders in the East and West leagues are Toronto and Vancouver, respectively. Vancouver are ten points ahead of nearest rivals Calgary and obviously are streets in front. Toronto are in a tight race with North York only two points adrift and Hamilton three points down. PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION NO. 2

The Regional Municipality of Halton is planning the above-mentioned project, pursuant to the Environmental Assessment Act.

The purpose of the Silver Creek trunk sewer study is to assess the provision of additional capacity for sanitary sewage flows to accommodate growth within the Georgetown Urban area. Proposed developments are presently being restricted due to capacity restraints in the existing trunk sewer.

The preferred option consists of a second 600 mm diameter sewer parallel to the existing 600 mm diameter trunk sewer in the Silver Creek Valley from Main Street to just east of Mountainview Road.

Various alternatives for expanding servicing capacity were evaluated in early 1989 during Phase 2 of the Class Environmental Assessment planning and design process. Alternative design concepts for twinning of the trunk sewer are currently being evaluated.

A second Public Information Session will be held from 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., Wednesday, July 12, 1989 in the Committee Room of the former Municipal Offices for the Town of Halton Hills on Trafalgar Road regarding the above mentioned project, to be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage Projects.
