

Man injured

Halton Hills Regional Police say a 23-year-old Georgetown man injured his ankle after it got caught between two electric jiggers at the Guelph Street Loblaws in Georgetown early Monday morning. Police report the man was using an electric jigger to unload some skids when he got his ankle caught. The ankle was probably broken, police report.

Wires cut

Power was lost at Black Box Control Limited on River Road in Georgetown when a man reportedly using a brick cutter, cut three hydro wires, last Thursday afternoon, police say. The complainant told police that when he went to investigate the blackout's source, he saw two males leaving the site where the wires were cut. The value of the damaged property was unavailable.

\$300 stolen

Police say approximately \$300 in cash was stolen from a Main Street apartment in Acton last Friday afternoon. Entry to the apartment was gained through the unlocked front door, police report.

Planters thrown


