Halton Manor could get new van

Halton Centennial Manor - the Regional seniors home located in Milton - could get a new \$62,000 van to transport seniors in wheelchairs.

The Manor has been using a Ford Club Wagon to transport seniors to recreational outings, but now needs a vehicle to accommodate wheelchair passengers, a Regional report says.

Of three tenders for a wheelchair van, the Region's administration and finance department chose a Thorndale company that offered \$62,085 for a Champion model van.

The Champion, says the Regional report, will withstand impact in a collision and is easier to repair than the lower-priced Supreme Senator 25, also offered

by Overland Custom Coach, manufacturer of the Champion.

A wheelchair van priced at almost \$66,000 and made by a Cambridge company was also rejected by the Region's staff.

The Region will use funds from both the Manor's upkeep budget and a vehicle replacement reserve fund.

The Region's administrative and finance department expects to get 50 to 70 per cent of the cost of the van back from the province.

Tasty Recipes

VIKING SALAD

- One 8 oz. can herring in wine sauce
- 3 cups cooked diced potatoes
- 1 can (1 lb.) diced beets, drained
- 1 large apple, peeled and diced
- 1 small onion, diced (1/2 cup)
- 1/4 cup peeled, diced cucumber
- 1/2 cup cider vinegar
- 1 hard cooked egg yolk

Drain liquid from herring into a large bowl. Dice herring. Add potatoes, beets, apple, onion, cucumber and herring to liquid in bowl. Drizzle with vinegar, toss lightly to mix. Spoon into a lightly oiled 6 cup bowl packing mixture down firmly with back of spoon. Chill at least 2 hours to firm.

Just before serving, loosen salad around edge with a knife, invert onto a large serving platter; lift off bowl. Press egg yolk through a sieve on top of salad.

Serve with cold cuts and cheese.
