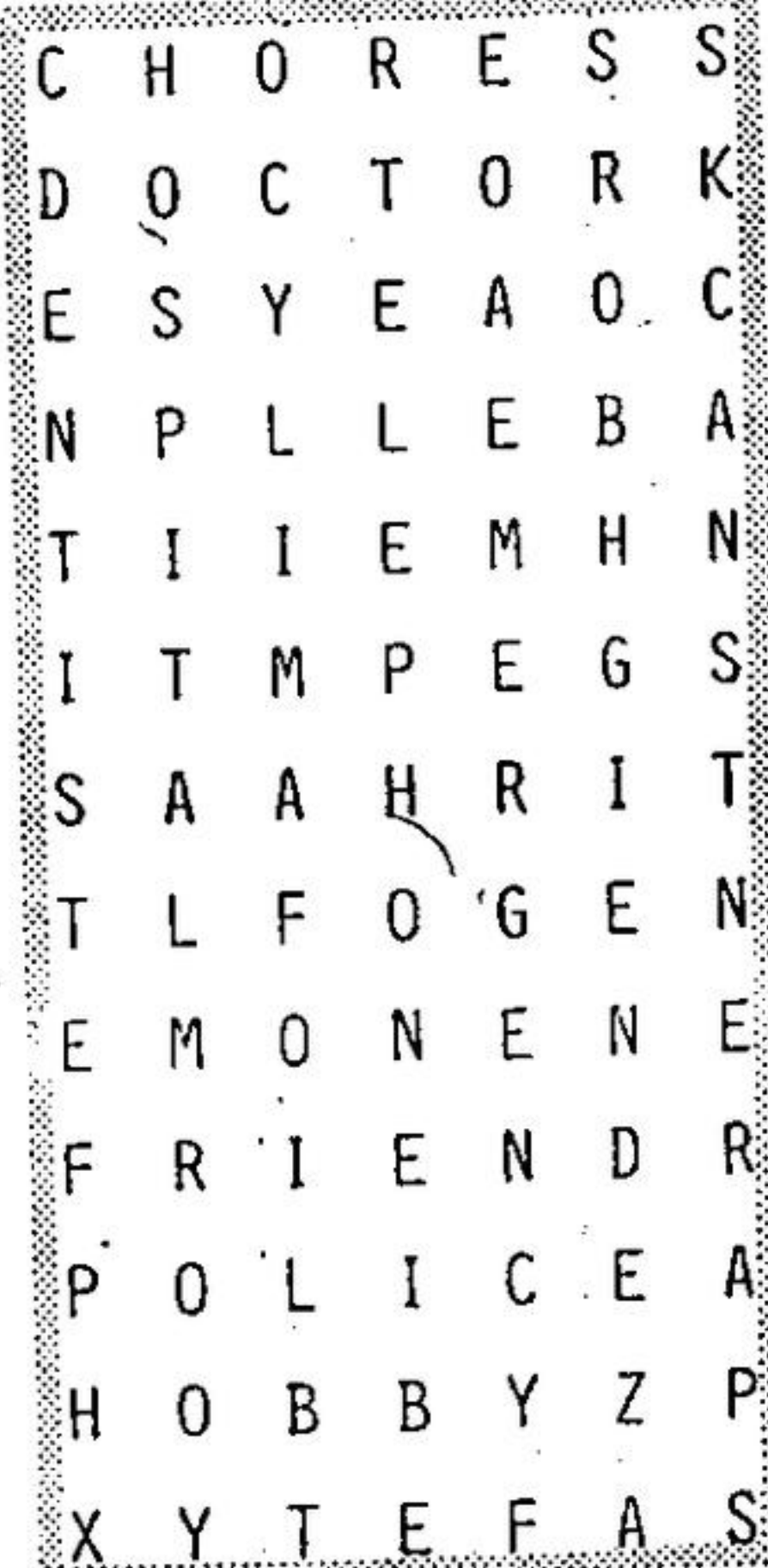
Special Directory

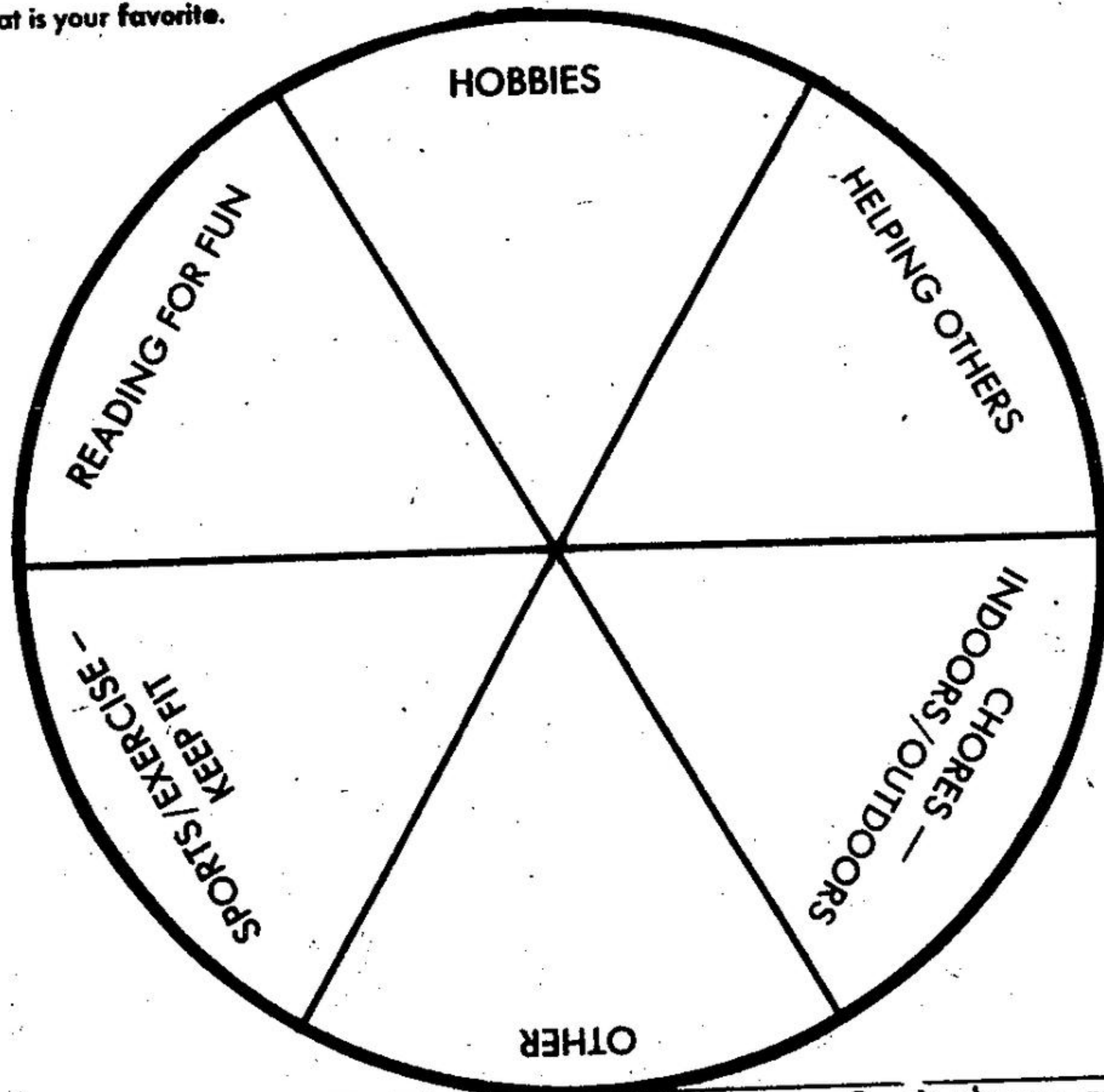
