# Lockwood steals show as confusion reigns

Confusion, consternation and more than a touch of condemnation marred an outstanding all-round athletic show put on by Dairy Queen's Gary Lockwood, in Georgetown Men's Flag Football League action Sunday.

The league games, normally played on the Georgetown high school field, were shifted to Acton High School, virtually at the last minute.

According to league spokesmen, word was received late Wednesday that the Georgetown High football field was under repair and therefore out of commission for games.

A scramble ensued getting a field to play on while at the same time, notifying team representatives of the change in venue.

As it turned out, the Georgetown high school field was playable. A small drainage ditch for a water pipe had been dug, at board of education directions, along one of

the goal lines. The whole operation was completed in approximately eight hours, but by this time, the league's executive had made the decision to play in Acton and didn't want to add to the confusion by reverting back to Georgetown.

Players weren't notified, players got lost and players' tempers frayed in the oppressive humidity that enveloped the area over the weekend.

Only two players showed up for Norval, which defaulted to Kerry Kitchens. Muscle Works defaulted to the Glen as game time and grace period deadline for fielding a proper team was missed.

In games played, M and M edged Oldtimers, 13-7; Longhorns doubled Corrigan, 24-12 and Gary Lockwood stole the show as defending league champion, Dairy Queen, pummelled Plus Welding, 45-0.

Long appreciated as one of the area's top athletes, Lockwood shifted into high gear in the second half of Sunday's game to cement the DQ win.

Dairy Queen led 21-0 at the half, but the fun had just begun.

In the second half, Lockwood accounted for all his squad's scoring. He and brother Jeff combined on three pass-and-run scoring plays, while Gary also scored on a long interception return. To rub salt on the Plus Welding wounds, Gary picked off another errant pass to run his league-leading interception total to eight. He has returned two interceptions for scores.

Hugo Dittfach, Ken Lockwood and Randy Lunn also scored majors for the winners. Jeff Lockwood rounded out the scoring by hitting for a convert and a single point off a missed field goal attempt.

M and M picked up two points from the Oldtimers and could barely suppress grins of relief as they exited the field. A last play pass from quarterback, John Viera was batted down in the end zone by Wes Samis to salvage the M and M win.

In the defensive struggle, the right foot of Simon Golding put the boots to the Oldtimers hopes.

Golding accounted for all the M and M scoring on three field goals and a single off a missed field goal attempt.

Paul Cunningham romped for a touchdown for the Oldtimers, with Bill Fournier converting.

The Longhorns 24-18 win over Corrigans was actually much closer than the score would indicate and three Longhorn interceptions in the second half blunted the Corrigan attack and

sealed their fate.

Longhorns led 17-6 at the half with Corrigan narrowing the gap to 17-12 early in the second half before the Longhorn defence stiffened.
