Junior hockey revolt Raider's loop loses teams

Two teams from the Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League have defected and will join seven teams formerly in the Metro Toronto Junior "B" Hockey League, to form the Metro Junior Hockey League, a division of the Metropolitan Toronto Hockey League.

According to Al Laing, Director of Operations for the Thornhill Thunderbirds, Vaughan Raiders and Mimico Monarchs are confirmed Metro Junior Hockey League entries, while a third Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League team, Richmond Hill Dynes, will make a decision this week whether or not to join the new league.

Laing said this was confirmed Monday night at a meeting held at the MTHL offices in Toronto.

Al Morris, Chairman of the Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League, and an OHA representative, stated in a telephone interview that, "This is all news to me," and questioned the veracity of the report.

Dave Kentner, President of the Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders of the Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League preferred to adopt a wait-and-see attitude until official word on the possible defections comes through from the league.

He did state, however, "The Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League is the strongest league in the OHA," and would be able to weather the loss of some member teams.

The new league would be comprised of Thornhill Thunderbirds, Bramalea Blues, Henry Carr Crusaders, Wexford Raiders, Pickering Panthers, Markham Laidlaws, Oshawa Legionnaires, Vaughan Raiders, Mimico Monarchs and possibly, Richmond Hill Dynes.
