Hooper confirmed that despite speculation to the contrary, Peter Sturgeon is definitely returning as coach of the Junior "B" squad.



Sabres will be able to draw from Erin, Guelph, Hillsburgh, Fergus and Elora as a result of the OHA decision.


A second open tryout camp has
