# Family swimming for pre-schoolers

New even the youngest member of your family can get in the swim! A new aquatic program designed for pre-schoolers is being launched at both the Acton and Georgetown Indoor Pools this fall. The program developed by the Ontario Division of the Canadian Red Cross Society, provides instruction for three groups of pre-school children.

"Waterbabies" provides water orientation for children under one year and includes their parent's participation. The one to five year old with mom or dad's support will learn Water Accommodation and Basic Swim Skills in the "Kinderswim" level. "Starfish is geared to the three to five year old non-swimmer, and does not involve parent participation.

The last of the new pre-school levels is "Guppy." This level is for the three to five year old and introduces the child to floatation skills with assistance (parents do not participate in this level). Registration for all aquatic programs begins Saturday, Sept. 9 at the Acton Indoor Pool or the Georgetown High School Library lobby entrance. 
Ian Burnham and Scott Enair scored for Milton.
