Halton police in Burlington are seeking assistance with their investigation into a home entry which netted the culprits \$53,000 worth of household goods and jewellery.

On Sunday, July 30, 1989, the owners of a home on Woodland Park Drive, Burlington returned home to find that their home had been looted.

Investigators found that the home had been entered by a rear door by four persons who removed numerous items including tables, chairs, rugs, pictures, television sets, silverware, china and jewellery.
