Look how much more Halton Hills residents recycled in the first half of 1989, compared to the same period in 1988 using the Blue Box Program:

We have recycled over 14% of our residential waste. Now we want to do even more! We're heading towards 20%. If everyone participates in the Blue Box Program, Halton Hills can be one of the first municipalities in Ontario to achieve this honour! Let's go Halton Hills — Pitch in.

350 TONNES







Each Blue Box represents 50 tonnes of material recycled in the first half of each year



To date in 1989, we have saved over 9,000 trees from being cleared to make newsprint.



Enough glass has been recycled to produce 350,000 average sized bottles.



Every tonne of steel cans recycled saves 1.6 tonnes of iron ore and the energy equivalent of 4 barrels of oil. Using recycled aluminum cans to make new cans requires 95% less energy than using raw material.


WE CANNOT RECYCLE

- 1. Catalogues, books
- 2. Window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, ceramics
- 3. Aerosol cans, foil wrap and other metal products
- 4. Detergent bottles, margarine containers and similar plastics
- Cereal boxes, kleenex boxes, shoe boxes, detergent boxes
