# Raiders face Oakville in first exhibition tilt

Phase two of pre-season activity begins tonight (Saturday), 7:30 p.m. for Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders, as they play host to Oakville in an exhibition game at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

The tryout camp is history, the main training camp has held two sessions (Tuesday and Thursday) and not it's time to test the Central Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League club's mettle against outside opposition.

Raider coach Peter Sturgeon, is extremely pleased with the training camp's phase of the team's preparation for the upcoming 1989-90 season and it is just about time to separate the wheat from the chaff.

Sturgeon termed training camp activity, "very competitive" and



despite the fact there were 11 returnees from last year's team at the camp, declared, "With very few exceptions, roster positions are up for grabs with the team."

It might only be an exhibition game, but the Raiders should have a bit of added incentive against Oakville.

The Raiders finished ahead of Oakville in regular season play last year, then were urdely bumped to the sidelines by Oakville in a first-round playoff upset.

The upset still leaves a bad taste in the collective mouths of Raider brass.

A surprise returnee at the main training camp was last year's regular netminder Curtis Green.

Green had been attending the Owen Sound Platers Major Junior "A" training camp but according to Sturgeon, took it upon himself to leave and return to the Raiders.

Cuts have already been made and Sturgeon noted that the week ahead, with three exhibition games on tap, will see the final make-up of the 1989-90 team.

Raiders journey to Oakville on Wednesday, trek to Milton Friday night, then play host to Milton, 7:30 p.m. next Saturday night at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

Sturgeon's coaching philosophy is based on the premise that a player "has to show he wants to play hockey."

With this in mind, tonight's exhibition game roster wasn't released and in fact, all players who survived Thursday night's cuts will be expected to show up early. Then and only then, will Sturgeon let the players know who will be suiting up for the game.

Six Raiders from last year's team are still at Major Junior "A" camps, but the coach still prefers to take preparation, "one day at a time."

There is no doubt the Raiders will have a solid nucleus of Junior "B" veterans entering regular season play but who makes the team is still up in the air for now.
