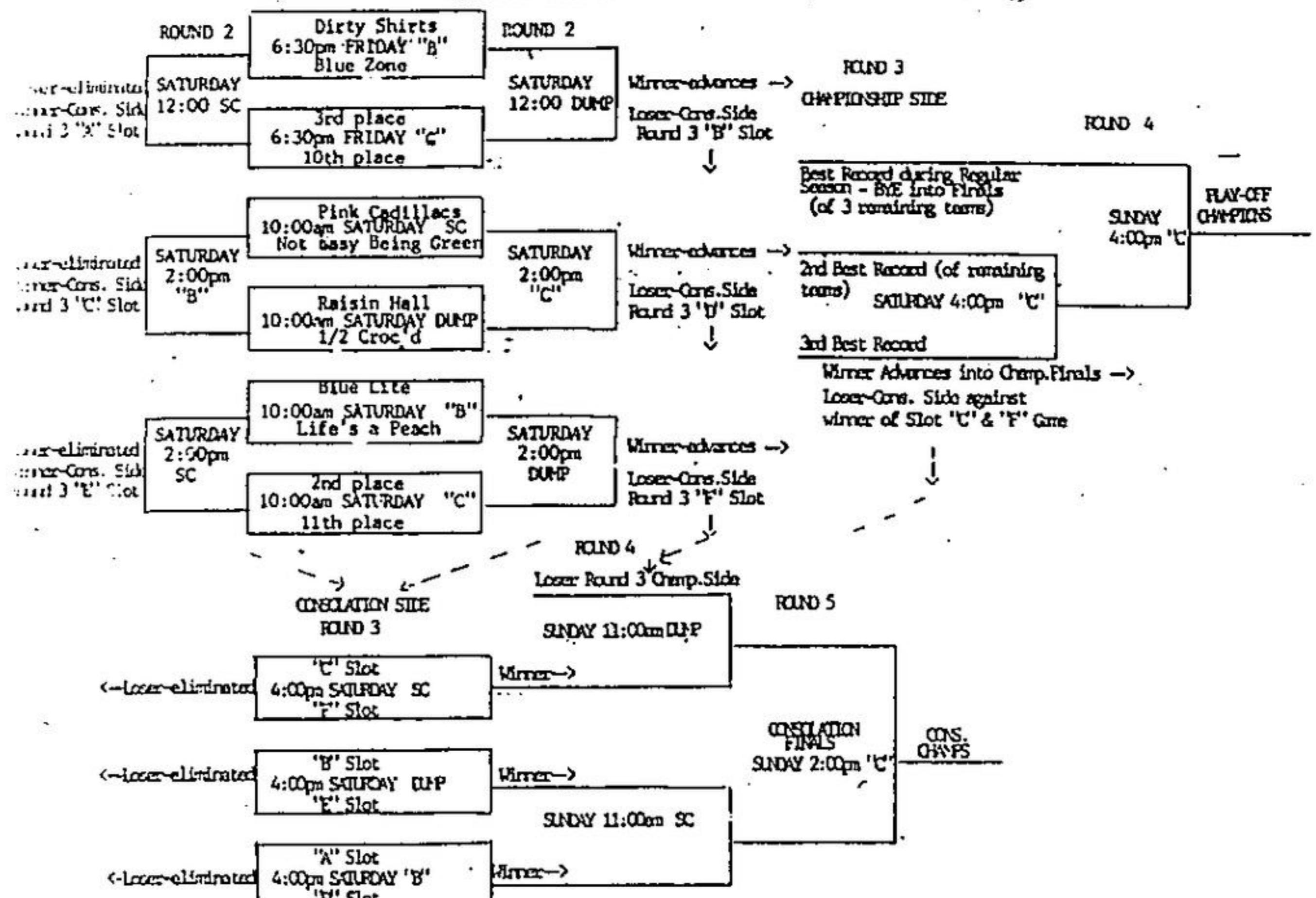
The tournament features a double-knockout format, so
