Dairy Queen dethroned

Corrigan ended the reign of Dairy Queen as rulers of the Georgetown Men's Flag Football League, by posting a somewhat surprisingly easy 46-24 win over DQ in league semifinal playoff action, Sunday at Georgetown high school field.

The other semifinal contest ran true to form, with Longhorns pummeling M and M, 49-3.

Corrigan challenges Longhorns in the league's championship game, Sunday, 11 a.m. at the Georgetown high school field.

Dairy Queen had claimed championship honors for four consecutive years and perhaps were looking ahead to meeting arch-rival Longhorns for the league's 1989 silverware.

This year's edition of Dairy Queen seemed to be missing something, however, all year long.

Despite winning the "A" Division regular season title, the DQ gang appeared to lack the spark and offensive consistency this year that had been the team's trademark in years past.

These missing ingredients, coupled with a number of injuries to key personnel proved fatal against an inspired Corrigan unit.

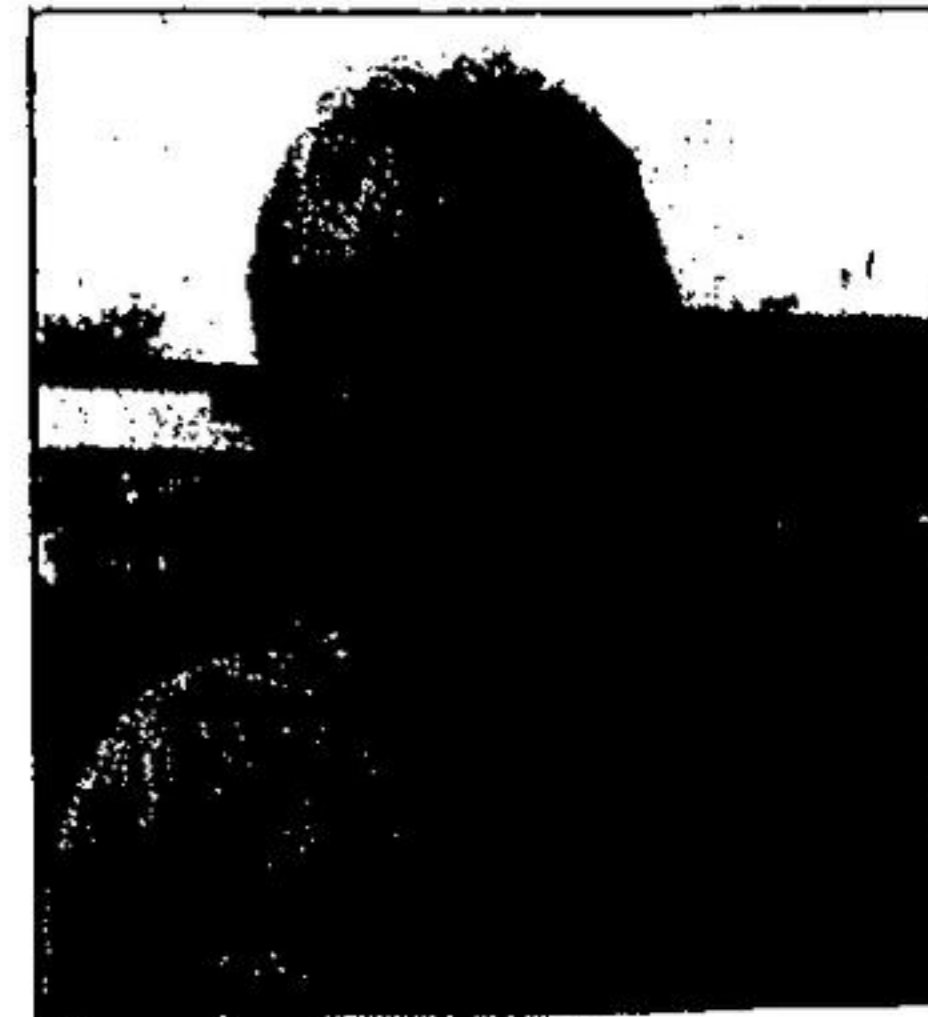
Corrigan played a complete game Sunday and the 46-24 final score, accurately reflects their dominance of the game.

The offensive firepower directed by strong-armed quarterback Pat McKinnon, was more than matched by a tenacious and disciplined defensive, which rose to the occasion whenever Dairy Queen threatened to get back in the game.

Corrigan scored on the first play of the game and midway into the first half, led 14-0. Interceptions by Wayne Stasivlis and Les Storr aided the cause.

Down 20-10 at the half and 26-10 early in the second half, Dairy Queen quarterback Mitch Leblanc, elected to go deep on almost every offensive play and dropped balls or overthrown receivers scuttled the DQ hopes.

To the team's credit, the dethroned league champions took the loss well and bowed out in style.
