

# Raiders host Oakville Blades

Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders hope to snap a two-game losing streak when they host Oakville Blades Saturday (tonight), 7:30 p.m. at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

The Raiders opened regular season Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League play Tuesday night in Streetsville but bowed 8-4 to the Derbys.

Raiders lost their final pre-season exhibition game 8-2 to Henry Carr Crusaders.

The Georgetown squad finished pre-season exhibition game play with a 3-2 won-lost record.

The team should have a bit of added incentive against Oakville tonight.

Last year Raiders finished regular season play in their division's fourth place, with Oakville right behind in fifth place.

The Blades pulled a bit of an upset by ousting the Raiders in the first round of playoff action.
