

Arm broken

Halton Regional Police laid charges of assault causing bodily harm Saturday in connection with a domestic situation occurring this past spring. A 43-year-old Georgetown man allegedly struck a Georgetown woman dislocating her shoulder and breaking her arm. The man appeared at a bail hearing Monday in connection with the charges.

Bounced cheques

A 21-year-old Acton woman allegedly wrote several fraudulent cheques worth a total value of \$200 on a closed account recently. Police have laid three charges of fraud in connection with the incident.

House robbery

Police say someone stole \$1,100 worth of property and cash from a residence in the area of Sideroad 15 east of Highway 25 in Halton Hills sometime last Thursday.

The culprit stole several items of jewelery, a Super 8 movie camera, an antique camera and \$15 in cash. Police say entry was gained through an unlocked rear glass sliding door. An investigation is ongoing.

Watch lifted

Someone stole a \$150 watch from a knapsack left in the bleachers area at Georgetown District High School last Thursday afternoon. Police say the owner left the knapsack in the bleachers and when the person returned the watch was gone.

Pouch poached

Police laid charges of theft under \$1,000 in connection with the theft of a leather travel pouch from the Olde Hide House in Acton last Thursday. A 60-year-old Toronto man is scheduled to appear in court Oct. 30 in connection with the charge.

Boat motor snagged

Police say someone stole a Mercury 125 horsepower outboard motor valued at \$600 from the back of a sail boat parked in the area of Winston Churchill Boulevard and Highway 7 in Norval sometime between Sept. 13 and Sept. 20.

Windows smashed

Police say someone used a large rock to smash two wire glass windows located at the southwest corner of St. Francis of Assisi School on Duncan Street in Georgetown sometime between the morning of Sept. 26 and the next night, police say. Damage is estimated at \$200.

Impaired charges

After stopping a 23-year-old Georgetown man who was suspected of impaired driving, police laid charges of possession of narcotics, Friday. Police searched the man and found what was thought, to be a marijuana cigarette. A Nov. 13 court date has been scheduled in connection with the incident.

Musical theft

Police laid charges of break and entering and theft after an 18-year-old Georgetown man allegedly used a two-by-four piece of wood to smash the front window of a Guelph Street music store in Georgetown and stole two guitars worth a total value of \$900 early last Thursday morning. About \$200 damage was caused to the window. Police recovered the guitars later the same day in a nearby backyard. The man is scheduled to appear in court Oct. 30 in connection with the charges.

Man charged

Police laid charges of possession of stolen property after they found a 21-year-old Georgetown man sleeping in the back of a pick-up truck parked in a Guelph Street parking lot in Georgetown early last Thursday morning. Police say the vehicle was stolen in Toronto. An Oct. 30 court date has been scheduled in connection with the incident.

Gas and meat gone



The general laborer was driving a two-seater dump vehicle up an incline at the Blue Springs Development construction site when the vehicle stalled and began to roll-> backwards. The vehicle struck a retaining wall and Mrs. Rhynold jumped from the vehicle landing six feet below in a creek. The vehicle flipped over the wall and landed beside the woman, police

At 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, September 19, 1989 the victim of this assault, Barry Boyce of Oakville, was found unconscious in Unit 6, 1252 Speers Road in Oakville. Mr. Boyce ran a Dickie Dee Ice Cream operation from this unit during the summer.

Mr. Boyce drove a 1987 rental Ford Van, white, with "Snowbird" on the side. Ontario Licence plate number MN7 847.

Mr. Boyce's van had been seen parked in the downtown Hamilton area on the evening of Monday, Sept. 18. It was later stolen sometime prior to Mr. Boyce being found severly beaten. The vehicle was later located near Hanrahan's Tavern in Hamilton. Did you see this vehicle on Sept. 18 or 19?


if no answer Georgetown Legion 877-4413 The victim was known to frequent Taverns and Bars in the Jackson and John Street area of downtown Hamilton.
