In the midget boys race Warren Daniell placed 100th with Sandy Bull taking 160th place.

The Bishop Reding High School-hosted meet attracted over 50 schools from as far away as London and Fenelon Falls.

At the prestigious 18th Annual TSSAA-TSSWAA High Park meet, Bob Donkers won the senior boys race besting a field of 250 runners. Don Campbell (20) Martin Davison (22) and David Scida (34) also competed.

The GDHS senior boys team placed second overall.

The junior girls team placed fourth overall, one point out of third place. Team members included Megan Lusby (11) Kristy Johnson (13) (Kristy moved up from midget division to compete in this race) and Sara Mulholland (17).

The GDHS midget girls team placed 9th overall, while the junior boys team also competed.
