

### Man spits at woman

Police report a 33-year-old Brampton man allegedly hit and spit at a 28-year-old Acton woman at a Main Street residence in Acton early Monday morning. Charges of assault have been laid in connection with the incident. A Nov. 6 court date has been scheduled.

### Cigarettes stolen

Halton Regional Police say someone stole \$200 cash and \$5,000 worth of cigarettes from a Guelph Street variety store in Georgetown overnight Sept. 26. The culprit twisted off the front door silver lock to enter the store. An investigation is ongoing.

### Compressor stolen

Someone stole a \$500 air compressor from a residence in the area of the Eighth Line in Halton Hills sometime between Sept. 21 and Sept. 24. Police say the person gained entry through an unlocked garage door. The garage is connected to the house.

# Police will be out in full force this weekend

Halton Regional Police will be out in full force this Thanksgiving weekend cracking down on impaired driving and seatbelt offences.

This weekend marks the last weekend the province's forces will be implementing the summer Reduced Impaired Driving Everywhere (R.I.D.E.) program, police say.

And since Oct. 1 seatbelt month police will be ticketing any seatbelt offenders.

For its part the Ontario Provincial Police will be "vigorously enforcing traffic laws" to reduce

accident-related fatalities.

Last Thanksgiving weekend 10 people died in 10 accidents on the province's roads, OPP officials say.

Like the Region's police force the OPP urge motorists to wear their seatbelts.

So far this year almost 600 people have died on the roads while, by this time last year, only 536 people had died, the OPP says.

"Unfortunately, holiday weekends are traditionally a time for tragedy OPP Inspector William Wickland said. "Drive wisely and don't become a statistic."
