# C.A.H.A.stresses fair play fair play league been implemented at

This season, any player in a CAHA league, who intentionally pushes, body checks or hits an opposing player from behind will be assessed a minor or major penalty. The penalty will be left to the referee's discretion, but a major penalty plus a game misconduct will automatically be assessed if an Injury results from a check from behind.

This amendment was one of several rule changes ratified at the association's annual meeting in May.

The CAHA has also taken action by eliminating body checking for all levels below peewee, by introducing new stickwork guidelines and by urging referees to crack down on enforcement of the rules.

The association's Initiation Program is also catching on all across the country. The program follows the "Learning the skills and having fun" theme of Minor Hockey Week, with children being taught the basic concepts of the game in a fun atmosphere, actually playing tag on the ice in order to learn the basic skills necessary to play the game.

These changes mark the latest step In the CAHA's efforts to reduce violence and stickwork and to promote fair play in its leagues in a direct partnership with the Commission for Fair Play.

Established in 1986, the Commission consists of former Olympic and professional athletes, coaches, referees, members of the sport media and representatives from the field of medicine and sport administration. The CAHA is represented by President Murray Costello. Other hockey personalities include Canadian Hockey League President Ed Chynoweth, former NHL referee Bruce Hood and broadcaster Danny Gallivan.

The Commission supports the efforts of groups like the CAHA with a

print and television advertisement campaign, posters, transit ads and resources for teachers, coaches and leagues.

The CAHA initiatives are a step in the right direction, but everyone Involved in hockey shares the responsibility of improving the game. "We are aware that this is not a one

week, one month or one year game plan," says Rick Parayre, CAHA's manager of officiating. "It's long term

and it is an education process for everyone - players, coaches, officials and parents."

Referees can make a commitment to fair play by remembering to enforce the rules consistently, regardless of the individual or the game situation. It is also the ref's responsibility to. remain knowledgeable and up to date about rule changes that may occur.

League administrators must also take a strong fair play stand on behalf of their league. Developing a fair play pledge to be signed by all participants - players, coaches and referees will encourage them to commit to playing fairly. Set fair play standards for your league and publicize them to all members.

In Quebec, the SCORE (Scoring Calculated On the basis of Recogniti tion of Ethics) Program rewards not only goals, but also a player's and a team's positive behavior with respect to opponents and officials.

In London, Ontario, the principles of the Quebec program have been taken a step further. Not only has a
