Sabres rattle for pair of victories

What a difference a year makes. Last year at this time the Acton Sabres organization would have been happy if enough players took to the ice to ensure a hockey game could be played. This time around, under solid sponsorship courtesy of Mitch LaJeunesse, a positive attitude and an

expanded player pool that allows team management to be more selective, the Acton Tait Realty Sabres just might make a serious run at the Mid-Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League championship. Two giant steps in this direction were taken over the weekend as the Acton squad claimed impressive wins over Alliston and Bradford, on the road, to open their



1989-90 season. Friday night in Alliston the Sabres posted a solid 8-5 victory and Sunday in Bradford the Acton crew romped to an 8-5 win. Bradford is the defending Ontario Junior "C" champion, so Sabre supporters would feel properly justified to crow a little. The Sabres didn't allow Alliston many opportunities to make a match of it Friday evening, by opening up a 3-1 first period lead and moving in front, 6-2 after 40 minutes of play. The teams matched a pair of third period goals to run the final count to 8-4 in Acton's favor. Pete Cargill, Craig Cullen and Jeff Shevalier each scored twice

for the Sabres against Alliston, with singles going to Tim McDonald and Bob Gagnon. Gagnon also collected two assists. Jim Manton played a fine game in the Acton nets. The Sabres might have been a bit road-weary early on against Bradford on Sunday but once the road-lag was shaken off, it was time to turn out the lights for the defending provincial champions. The game was knotted 1-1 after the first period and Acton edged ahead, 5-4 after two periods. Superior conditioning paid off for the Sabres in the third frame as they potted three markers to but a single reply from Bradford to leave the hometown pucksters breathing ice chips. Jim Manton played another solid game in the Sabre nets, making 33 saves. Fifteen of the stops came in the second period with Bradford threatening. Craig Cullen collected a hat-trick for Acton (five goals in two games) and picked up a pair of assists to pace the Sabre attack.

Bob Gagnon scored twice and had an assist for the Sabres. For Gagnon, it was his third game in as many nights, as the native of Hearst had suited up for the Junior "B" Raiders, Saturday night against Milton. Jeff Shevalier, Dave McNiven and Mark Brommersma rounded out the Sabre scoring. Sabre fans will have an opportunity to show their appreciation for the hometown favorites this weekend, as the Tait Realty squad plays two home games. Friday, 8 p.m. at the Acton Community Centre, the Sabres play host to Orangeville Crushers. Last season, Orangeville topped the Mid Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League over the regular season, but were ousted by Bradford in the playoffs. Orangeville gained some revenge by downing Bradford 11-6 in their opening game of the 1989-90 schedule. Sunday afternoon, 1:30 p.m. at the Acton Community Centre, the Sabres play host to Alliston.

Julie Ross captures gold

Georgetown's Julie Ross basked in the national limelight in Edmonton over the weekend and Monday the glow turned to gold as the 17-year-old athlete and her Oakville Polydrain teammates won the national under-18 girls soccer championship by defeating Vancouver Kerrisdale Express 4-1 in double overtime. The gold medal win has earned Julie and her team an invitation to the prestigious Orange Bowl soccer tournament this December in Miami where the competition will feature teams from across the United States as well as some overseas entries. Julie described her soccer sojourn to Edmonton as "a great experience." She especially enjoyed meeting and mingling with competitors from across Canada. Oakville advanced to the national gold medal game by defeating Quebec 5-0 then downing Alberta 1-0. The game against the British Columbia champion was knotted 1-1 after regulation time and the score remained the same after the first overtime period before Oakville prevailed.

While Julie didn't collect any goals at the national level, she proved her worth - and versatility - to the eventual national champions by seeing duty at fullback, mid-field and forward positions. In late August, the Polydrain outfit travelled to Denmark for a 10-day playing tour of the Scandinavian country. No doubt, Miami will prove an equally interesting adventure when December rolls around. Julie has been a member of the Polydrain team for the past two years but next year she will be moving up to the under-21 senior women's level.
