# Raiders host Streetsville

Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders are hoping the old adage, 'There's no place like home' will stand them in good stead heading into a pair of Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League West Division matches this weekend.

Raiders dropped two game last weekend 6-1 to Milton Merchants, in Milton, Friday night and 7-5 to Oakville Blades, at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, Saturday evening and have had the whole week to stew about their discouraging 1-8 record.

Both Raider games scheduled for this weekend are home encounters.

The Raiders' lone victory of the 1989-90 Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League season, came at the expense of Peterborough. The Georgetown crew invaded Peterborough's home turf and skated away with a 10-7 win.

The Raiders opened the 1989-90 campaign in Streetsville and came out on the short end of an 8-4 decision in favor of the Derbys.

The two teams' respective fortunes have since gone in opposite directions.

While the Raiders languish at the bottom of the league's West Division standings, Streetsville is challenging for the division lead.

Tuesday night, Streetsville defeated Milton Merchants 5-3, to gain a share of the division's second place with Milton - both teams had 13 points.

Streetsville was scheduled to play in Milton, Friday evening, at press time, the score was not available.

According to Raider coach Peter Sturgeon, the club paid cash to the Metropolitan Toronto Hockey League for the release of Kevin Brown and it is expected he will suit up for weekend action with Georgetown.

Defenceman Davin Ciglen, returned to the Raider fold this past week and popped the lone Georgetown marker in the 6-1 loss to Milton.

Sturgeon is also haggling with a number of Ontario Hockey League teams for an infusion of new blood in an effort to get the Raiders back on the winning track before their whole 1989-90 season is derailed.
