

# Sabres looking to halt skid

Acton Tait Realty Sabres will attempt to get back on the winning track in Mid-Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League action this weekend and at the same time, weather the storm of controversy that has swirled around the team this past week.

The Sabres broke out of the regular season starting blocks in fine fashion, winning their first two league encounters - both games played on the road.

Since then, things have literally gone downhill.

The Acton squad has dropped four games in a row, since their auspicious start - most recently, 10-7 to Caledon and 4-2 to Bradford.

Sabres have two games slated for this weekend.

Friday night, the Sabres travelled to Orangeville for a return match with the Crushers. (At press time, the score was not available).

The Sabres have a score to settle with the hometown Crushers as Orangeville waltzed into the Acton Community Centre two weeks ago and hung a humiliating 14-3 loss on the Acton team.

Saturday night (tonight) the Sabres play host to Alliston Hornets, game time 8:30 p.m. at Acton Community Centre and Acton has reason to view the Hornets with a less than hospitable demeanor.

Acton downed Alliston 8-4 in the club's season-opener, in Alliston, but then the Hornets played turn-



around-fair-play on the Sabres and won 7-5 at Acton Community Centre.

The cloud of controversy hanging over the collective heads of the Sabres comes about because of new team owner Mitch Lajeunesse's decision (over the objections of other members of the Sabres executive) to use Chris Cambouris in nets for the Caledon game.

Cambouris' playing rights belong to the Georgetown Minor Hockey Association and the Sabres played Cambouris without first getting his release from the GMHA.

The GMHA filed tampering charges with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association; the Ontario Hockey Association subsequently fined the Sabres \$100 and suspended Sabre coach Ken Steen, for one game and the Sabres are now attempting to get their house in order with ill-feelings surfacing all over.

To compound the Sabres problems, Lajeunesse was admitted to hospital this week, complaining of chest pains.

No doubt, a string of Sabre victories will help in treating the Acton wounds.

# Rebels clinch East crown
