
CRIME STOPPERS



Crime Stoppers of Halton and the Halton Regional Police are asking for the public's help in solving the theft of a Ford (tractor) truck and 40 foot trailer and its contents from the locked compound of a transport company in Oakville.

Some time between Oct. 15-16, 1989 a Ford truck and trailer, with a 40 ft. shipping container attached to the trailer, containing 7,296 stuffed toys, was stolen from the locked compound of Garfield Transport located at 1143 Invicta Road in Oakville.

The stolen items are described as follows:

-A 1978 Ford tractor, blue, lic. T05266, Ontario 1989 issue, VIN U91VUAH0825;

-A 1987 STRICK trailer white in color VIN ISI2GC402HB657151; this trailer will have "K Line Chassis" on the side with serial number KKKLC100432.

Truck, 7,300 stuffed toys stolen in Oakville.

Attached to the above tractor chassis is a 40 foot shipping container, red in color with the name "K Line" on the sides. Serial KLFU1106914. This shipping container contained 7,296 stuffed toys with a value of \$33,000.

Description of the toys: 11 inches high, make "NICKI" white plush stuffed teddy bears. Each toy has a red plastic stethoscope around its neck. There are 12 toys per carton and there were 608 cartons in the container.

The total value of this theft is \$66,000.

Crime Stoppers is asking for anyone with any information on this theft to call. Did you see this tractor being moved on the dates in question?

Pair suffer major injuries

Charges of impaired driving causing bodily harm, and draining without a license or seatbelt were laid after a 1988 Dodge went out of control leaving the road and striking several trees at Winston Churchill Boulevard and Old Pine Crescent in Halton Hills late Thursday night. The vehicle's

driver, a 25-year-old Meadowvale man and his passenger also 25, were taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital and treated for major injuries. The two have since been released, hospital officials say. A Dec. 11 court date has been scheduled in connection with the incident.

Car flipped


