# Acton man charged after spree of stolen vehicles

Halton Regional Police laid charges of theft over \$1,000 in connection with a spree of stolen vehicles that started three and half months ago.

A 24-year-old Acton man will appear at a bail hearing Friday, Nov. 3 in connection with the theft charges, and a charge of possession of stolen property.

On July 17, someone stole an \$11,000 van parked on Nelson Crescent in Acton and drove it to Whitby where it was abandoned.

The next theft occurred Sept. 19 when someone stole a \$1,500 Mercury parked in the area of Crescent Street in Acton. The culprit drove the vehicle to Erin Township and left it in a ditch.

Poice say someone stole a Halton Hills taxi cab that was left

unlocked and running on Mill Street in Acton Tuesday afternoon. The person drove the vehicle to the area of Sideroad 20 and Town Line where it was abandoned. Police found the vehicle off the roadway smashed up against a hydro pole.

Charges of leaving the keys in the ignition were laid in connection with this particular incident. A 49year-old Georgetown man was charged with leaving the keys in the car.

Later that afternoon someone stole a Ford van from the area of Sideroad 22 and the Town Line, and drove it to Milton. The car was then abandoned after being involved in a two-car collision.

Police made the arrest Wednesday morning at a Milton area high school.

## Pair suffer major injuries in collision

A 10-year-old Rockwood girl and her father suffered major injuries following a two-car collision at Highway 7 and Trafalgar Road in Halton Hills late last Friday night.

Tricia and Bruce McGivern were rushed by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where Mr. McGivern is currently in stable condition. Tricia had to be air lifted to the Sick Children's Hospital in Toronto where she is listed in fair condition.

Milton Ontario Provincial Police say the accident occurred when a 1978 Chevrolet travelling eastbound on Highway 7 was turning left on Trafalgar Road, colliding with a 1984 Pontiac, travelling westbound on Highway 7. Mr. McGivern was driving the Pontiac and a 19-year-old Hillsburgh woman was driving the Chevrolet.

Police charged a woman with not giving the right-of-way following the incident.

The event runs from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.


## Parents meet
