

# Terry Champ makes Fiddler work

The musical numbers associated with Fiddler on the Roof are both lyrical and haunting and musical director Terry Champ has once again taken on the task of blending voices and orchestra to make the sounds from the stage memorable to the audience.

Probably the most memorable numbers from the show are "If I Were a Rich Man," a solo number sung by Tevye (Joe DelGuidice), "Sunrise, Sunset," sung by the entire cast, "To Life," sung by the male cast members and "Matchmaker, Matchmaker," sung by the three daughters. Whatever the musical challenge may be, solo, duet, or entire company, Terry Champ's musical guidance will ensure that they are performed in the Globe "tradition" of fond memories for everyone involved with the production.

Terry Champ's love for music propelled him to learn more and more about his craft and his skills are basically self-taught. Terry's initial involvement with Musical Theatre was as a member of the chorus in the Brampton Musical Society where he played in such shows as Oklahoma. When Globe Productions was re-born, Terry took baton in hand and was musical director for Oklahoma, New Girl In Town, L'il Abner, Brigadoon and Kiss Me Kate.

Besides assisting the artistic director in selecting the people who appear as leads and members of the chorus in each of these shows, Terry, an accomplished musician himself, is also responsible for assembling an orchestra

that will compliment the chorus in each show. This involves many extra rehearsals for Terry and the members of the orchestra before the orchestra and cast members come together for the final rehearsals for the show.

Assisting Terry at every rehearsal, with cast or orchestra is the pianist, Diana Collett. Diana is a Georgetown native who was a member of St. John's Church choir from the age of six. She is a recent graduate of the University of Western Ontario where she obtained a bachelor of music in education. She plans to attend Teacher's College in the fall with a goal of teaching as a primary music specialist. Besides playing the

piano, Diana was a flautist with the United States Collegiate Wind Band who toured Europe in the summer of 1985. Fiddler on the Roof is Diana's second show with Globe.

Other members of the orchestra are: Jack Kirkup, John Gooch, Afanna Plucinsky, violins; Maria Anderson, viola; Tim Jones, Bob Lovett, trombone; John Duellik, Anky Weseind, trumpet; Margaret Harmsworth, flute/piccolo; Al Heatley, Jill Morris, clarinet; Joan Morris, bass clarinet; Sam Cuttell, tuba.
