Man charged

Minimal injuries

Ambulance attendants rushed a 73-year-old Acton woman to District Georgetown and Memorial Hospital where she was treated for minimal injuries following a two-car collision on

Guelph Street east of Sinclair Avenue in Georgetown the afternoon of Oct. 30. Police say the woman was a passenger in a 1985 Ford being driven eastbound when a 1986 Subaru pulling out of

a private drive collided with the Ford. A 41-year-old Acton woman was driving the Ford and a 52year-old Georgetown man was driving the Subaru. Both cars were demolished. Charges of not giving the right of way were laid following the incident.

Ornament missing


