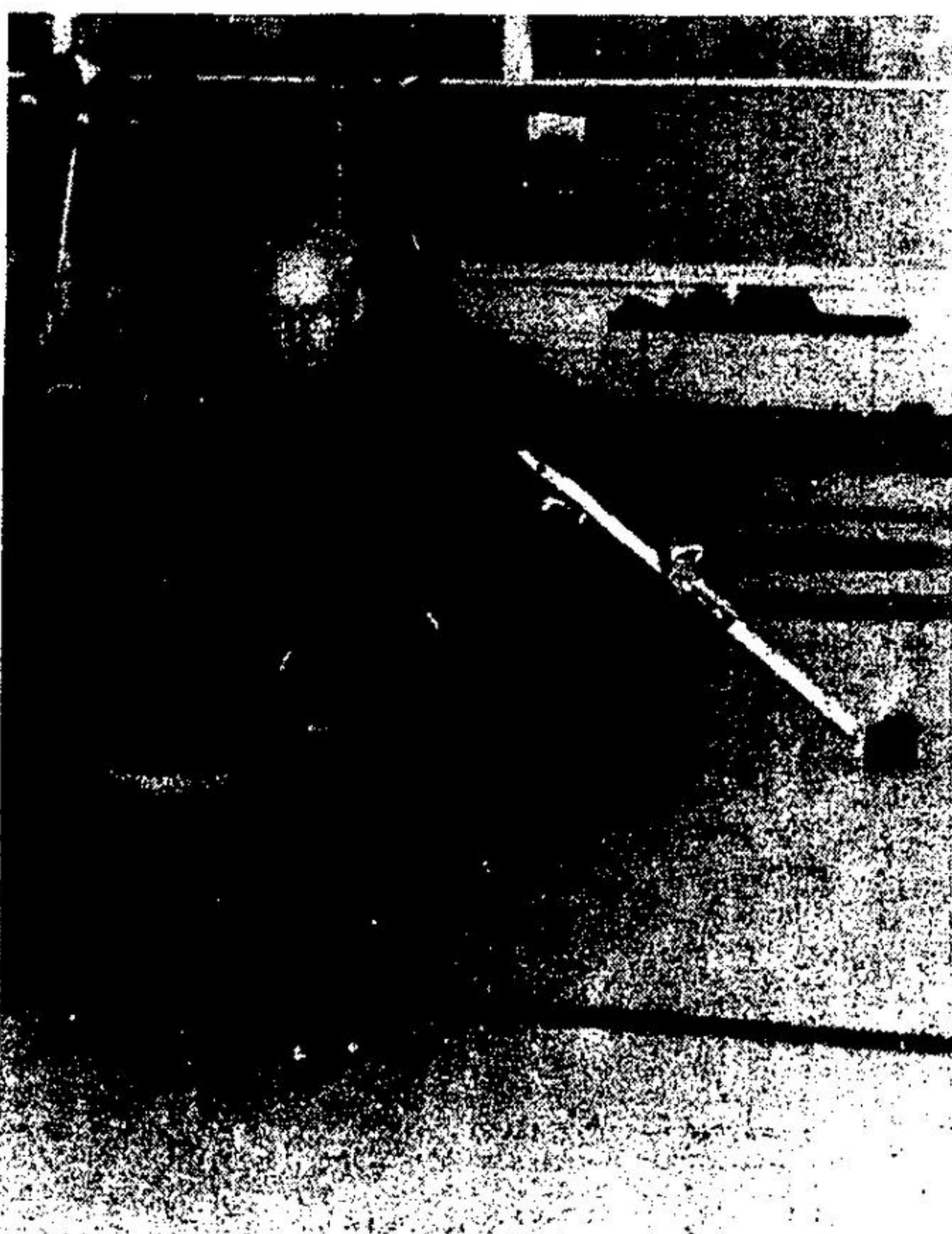

Sunny Acres started well in tournament play, coming from behind to nip London 2-1 in their opening game, Friday night.

Brad Tutt and Mark Lorito potted the Georgetown goals with Sean Guistini, Jake Poulstrup and Rob Boyle collecting assists.

Paul St. Pierre manned the Georgetown nets in the tournament-opener.

Sunny Acres next faced Oshawa Red in a Saturday afternoon clash and Oshawa posted a comfortable 7-2 win by scoring the game's last five goals.

Through two periods, Sunny Acres were in the contest, and they

The Rebels handily claimed the bronze award by thumping Orangeville 15-6.

Joanne Bingham solid team player

Georgetown native Joanne Bingham has been instrumental to the success of the Western Michigan University volleyball team. Bingham is currently averaging 4.83 kills per game, which is also leading the Mid-American Conference.

This season she has set WMU records for kills in three-game match (21 vs. Central Michigan, 10-21-89), kills in a four-game match (28 vs. Michigan, 10-10-89), kills in a five-game match (38 vs. Eastern Michigan, 10-27-89).

WMU is 15-8 (7-0 MAC) and has won four straight matches to date. The Broncos own a 98-match regular season conference winning streak dating back to 1982.
