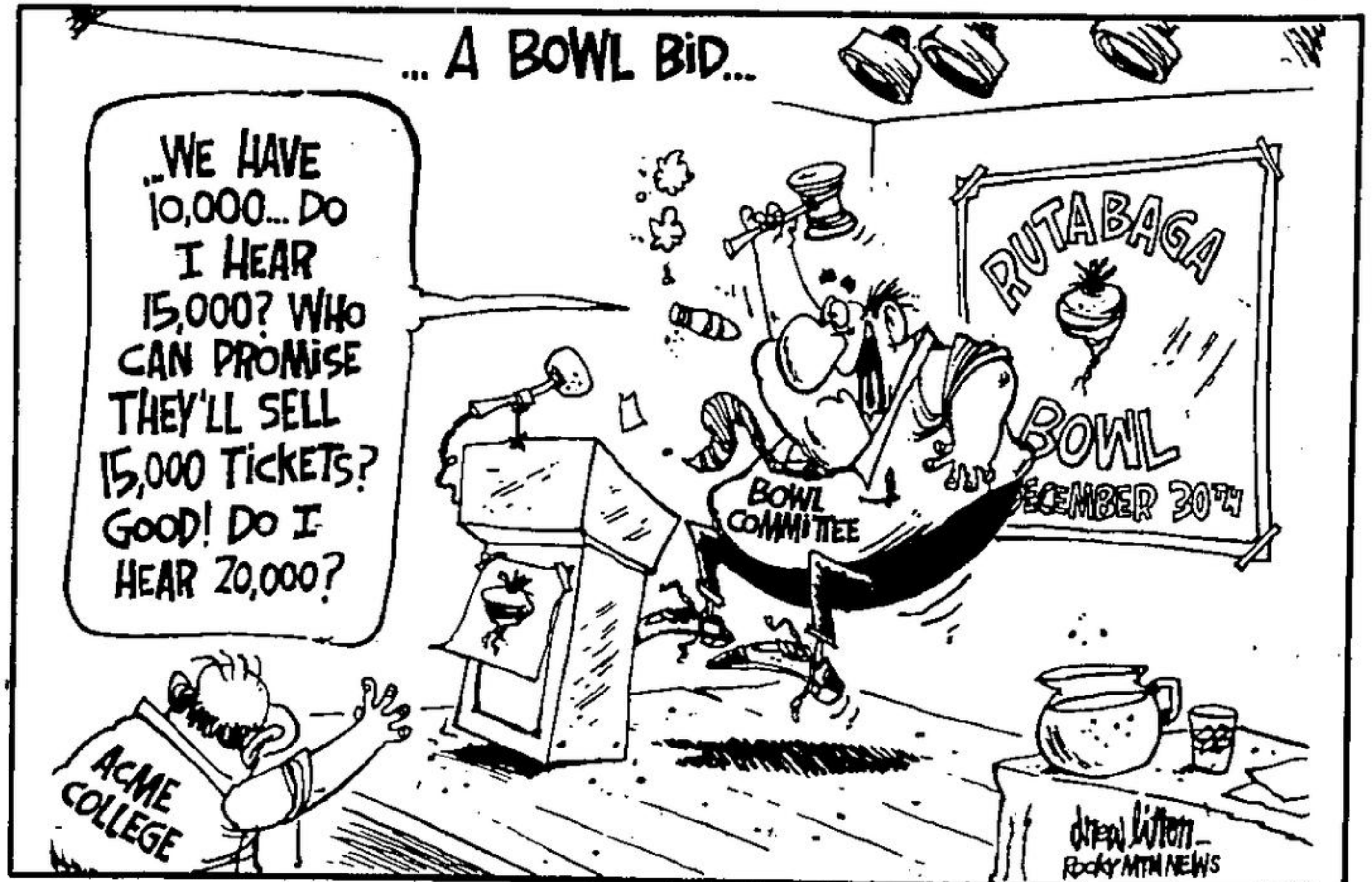

Last Thursday, the Acton High School Junior boys' volleyball team, lost their Halton semi-final match with E.C. Drury.

The Redmen put on an exciting contest with their year-long Milton rivals forcing the semi-finals to a complete five game set. Acton picked up two victories in the first two games winning 15-10 and 15-12 before Drury came back to take the third game 15-13.

The Redmen defence fell apart in the fourth game losing 15-2.

In the finale, the fifth and deciding match, Drury held on to defeat the Redmen in a tense 15-10 victory.

The coaches of both teams could not help but smile at the end of this series for Acton and Drury had faced each other previously in three tournaments and in league play and, true to form, the action was exciting and the close-score outcome always in doubt.

Ken Ellis of Acton said, "If the fans had ever been charged for admission, I'm sure supporters of

both teams would say that they had gotten their money's worth! If we had to lose, it was only fitting that it be to a team with which we had had such a great rivalry all season."

The Acton Junior boys' volleyball team travelled to Burlington Nov. 7 to compete in quarter-final playoff action against the powerful undefeated West Division champions, Lester Pearson.

The Acton squad, fresh off of a victory against the Rebels in Georgetown, quickly took command of the Pearson Panthers downing the Burlington team in three straight games by scores of 15-10, 15-12, and 15-1.

The Redmen attack was led by the powerful hitting of Bill Andrews, but coach Ken Ellis felt that the main reason for his team's success was the ability of the entire squad to dig deep when it counts and give the game their best shot.
