**Impaired charge**

Halton Regional Police laid a charge of impaired driving after they found a vehicle smashed up against a pole at the corner of Confederation Street and Wildwood Road in Glen Williams early Thursday morning. A 22-year-old Georgetown man is to appear in court Jan. 8 in connection with the incident. Police say the vehicle went out of control then smashed into a fence. The driver then reversed the vehicle and it hit a pole. The person then abandoned the vehicle and walked to his home.

**Theft charge**

Police charged a 24-year-old Georgetown man with theft after a man was observed leaving a Guelph Street department store in Georgetown wearing a missing sweatshirt. The sweatshirt was valued at \$17. A Jan. 8 court date has been scheduled in connection with the incident.

**Charge laid**

A charge of impaired driving was laid following a single-car accident at Trafalgar Road and Sideroad 32 in Halton Hills overnight Nov. 17, police say. A 27-year-old Georgetown man is to appear in court Jan. 8 in connection with the incident.

Police laid a charge of impaired driving after they saw a man driving erratically westbound on Guelph Street at Sinclair Avenue in Georgetown early Sunday morning. A 26-year-old Georgetown man will appear in court Dec. 18 in connection with the charge.

Someone caused about \$1,200 damage to the window of a Mill Street business in Georgetown after using an unknown object to crack the window from top to bottom sometime between Saturday night and the next morning, police say.

The Halton Regional Police Force in Oakville are seeking the public's assistance in the investigation of two major thefts from a variety store on Kerr Street. Both thefts have occurred at the 7-Eleven Store, 570 Kerr Street in Oakville during business hours. The first theft took place July 11 sometime between 1:30 and 3 p.m. When the lone clerk became busy with customers, the manager left the office to assist, leaving lottery tickets on the desk. When he returned to his office, he discovered that an unknown suspect had stolen a variety of lottery tickets, valued over \$1,000. The second theft occurred Oct. 23 sometime between 11 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. The suspect entered the store room at the rear of the store, while the lone clerk was oc-

cupied with customers. The suspect pried open a metal cabinet and removed 53 cartons of various brands of cigarettes, placing them in a plastic garbage bag and left the store via the aisles. Total value was over \$1,000. Investigators suspect the same individual is responsible for both thefts. Crime Stoppers will pay up to \$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest in this case or any other case. Callers are not required to reveal their identities or to testify in court. BMW parked on Pennington Crescent in Georgetown, early last Sunday morning.

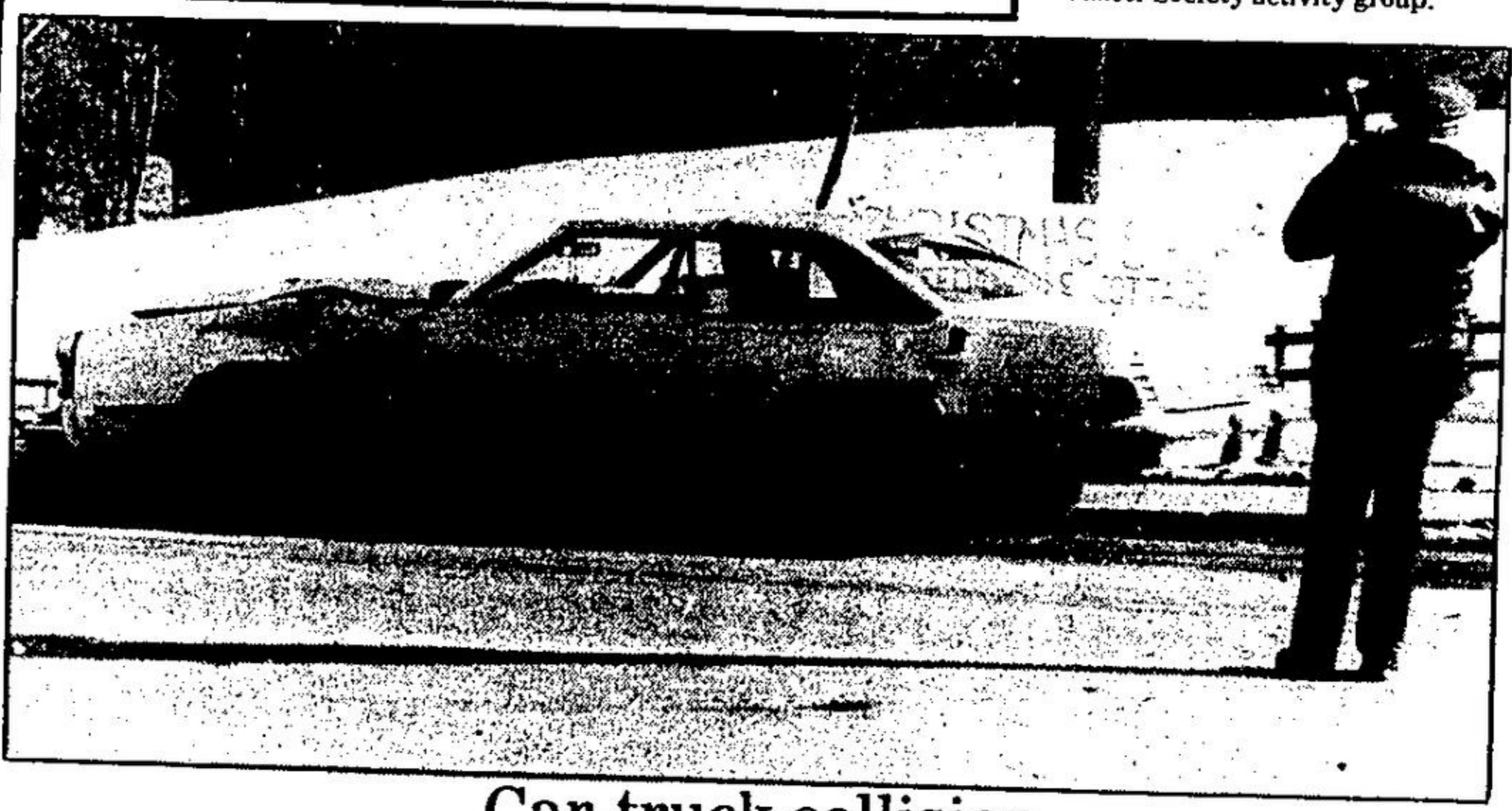
