Congratulations to all competitors.

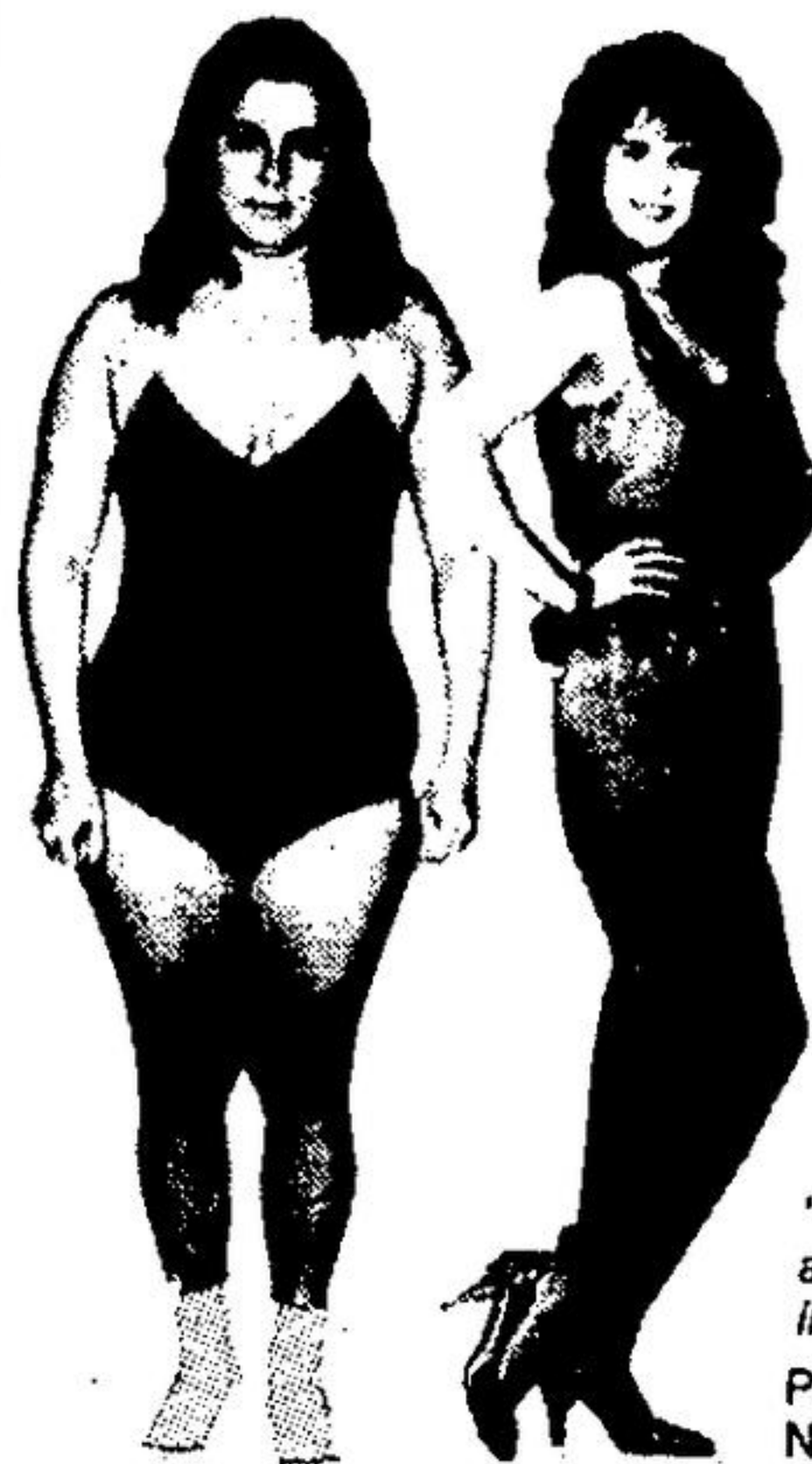
