Busy week for Major Peewees

Bodanis B's post mixed results

The Georgetown Major Peeewe "AA" Bodanis Bruins finished the week two for two in Tri-County league play, and one for two in tournament action.

Single markers were recorded by Duke Bouskill, Jim Katsilieris, Stephen Yurichuk, Matt Brain and Blaine McCauley. Katsilieris, Mark Aldridge and Jamie Stephenson each earned two assists, while single helpers went to Brain and Stephen Onoprijenko. John Waller was very sound in the Bodanis Bruins net.

In Erin Thursday night, the Major Peeewe again scored nine

goals, six coming in the third period, in a 9-2 victory. Doug Sheppard led the offensive charge for the Bodanis Bruins with two goals and three assists. Yurichuk chipped in with two goals and an assist, and Onoprijenko added two goals.

McCauley, Bouskill and Erler added single markers. Katsilieris earned two assists, with single helpers to Brain, McCauley, Bouskill, Aldridge, Brent Wilkinson, Erler and Stephenson.

It was Chad Hughes' turn to watch his Georgetown teammates turn on the offensive power from his netminding position.
